A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend sections 32-515, 79-748, 79-760.04, 79-760.05, 79-1201, 79-1202, 79-1217.01, and 2 79-1225, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and 3 sections 79-1217 and 79-2104.02, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010; to change provisions relating to educational service units; to eliminate 6 provisions relating to and withdraw from the Compact for 7 8 Education; to eliminate provisions relating to a student 9 achievement coordinator; to harmonize provisions; to provide an operative date; to repeal the original 10 sections; to outright repeal sections 79-11,150, 79-1501, 11 79-1503, and 79-1504, Reissue Revised Statutes of 12 Nebraska; and to declare an emergency. 13

14 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 32-515, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 32-515 Candidates for the boards of educational service
- 4 units, except boards of educational service units with only one
- 5 member school district, shall be elected to represent the
- 6 geographical boundaries election districts of the educational service
- 7 unit as provided in section 79-1217. The terms of members elected in
- 8 2008 to represent odd-numbered election districts established
- 9 pursuant to section 79-1217.01 shall expire in 2011. The terms of
- 10 members elected in 2008 to represent even-numbered election districts
- 11 established under such section shall expire in 2013. Successors to
- 12 the members elected in 2008 shall be elected for terms of four years.
- 13 Candidates for the board of educational service units shall meet the
- 14 qualifications found in section 79-1217. Board members shall be
- 15 elected on the nonpartisan ballot.
- 16 Sec. 2. Section 79-748, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 17 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 18 79-748 (1) The Legislature finds and declares that:
- 19 (a) Global economic competition is making new demands
- 20 upon the school system of the state;
- 21 (b) The competitiveness of the United States in the new
- 22 global economy will require that schools effectively educate all
- 23 students and prepare them to develop the capacity to learn new skills
- 24 and tasks quickly and to apply this knowledge in creative and
- 25 imaginative ways, in novel contexts, and in collaboration with

- 1 others;
- 2 (c) The need to fundamentally restructure education to
- 3 meet the challenges and opportunities of a constantly changing
- 4 technological economy is recognized and endorsed by such diverse
- 5 groups as the Committee for Economic Development, an organization of
- 6 some eighty chief executive officers of American corporations, the
- 7 Education Commission of the States, the National Education
- 8 Association, the American Federation of Teachers, and the National
- 9 Governors' Association; and
- 10 (d) The restructuring of the school system is a long-
- 11 term, evolving process with the principal goal being to develop a
- 12 system that ensures that all students learn to use their minds well
- 13 as a result of their education.
- 14 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to stimulate
- 15 ideas and visions that go beyond the traditional models of schooling
- 16 and to encourage the development of public-private partnerships in
- 17 establishing and supporting reform in education.
- 18 Sec. 3. Section 79-760.04, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 19 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 20 79-760.04 (1) For each learning community, any
- 21 educational service units that have member school districts that are
- 22 part of such learning community shall develop and implement a joint
- 23 plan to establish grade level standards and provide for
- 24 developmentally appropriate assessment of students in grades
- 25 kindergarten through three. The joint plan shall include, but not be

1 limited to, the subject areas of reading and mathematics and shall be

- 2 developed to measure student progress toward such standards.
- 3 (2) The coordinator appointed pursuant to section
- 4 79-11,150 and the State Department of Education shall provide
- 5 assistance in the development of the standards and assessment
- 6 described in subsection (1) of this section.
- 7 (3) School districts shall report data collected pursuant
- 8 to the plan described in subsection (1) of this section to such
- 9 educational service units. The data shall conform with the data
- 10 collection procedures established for the student identifier system
- 11 pursuant to section 79-760.05.
- Sec. 4. Section 79-760.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 13 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 14 79-760.05 (1) The State Board of Education shall
- 15 implement a statewide system for tracking individual student
- 16 achievement, using the student identifier system of the State
- 17 Department of Education, that can be aggregated to track student
- 18 progress by demographic characteristics, including, but not limited
- 19 to, race, poverty, high mobility, attendance, and limited English
- 20 proficiency, on available measures of student achievement which
- 21 include, but need not be limited to, national assessment instruments
- 22 and state assessment instruments. Such a system shall be designed so
- 23 as to aggregate student data by available educational input
- 24 characteristics, which may include class size, teacher education,
- 25 teacher experience, special education, early childhood programs,

1 federal programs, and other targeted education programs. School

- 2 districts shall provide the department with individual student
- 3 achievement data from assessment instruments required pursuant to
- 4 section 79-760.03 in order to implement the statewide system.
- 5 (2) The department and the coordinator appointed pursuant
- 6 to section 79-11,150 shall annually analyze and report on student
- 7 achievement for the state, each school district, and each learning
- 8 community aggregated by the demographic characteristics described in
- 9 subsection (1) of this section. The department shall report the
- 10 findings to the Governor, the Legislature, school districts,
- 11 educational service units, and each learning community. Such analysis
- 12 shall include aggregated data that would indicate differences in
- 13 achievement due to available educational input characteristics
- 14 described in subsection (1) of this section. Such analysis shall
- 15 include indicators of progress toward state achievement goals for
- 16 students in poverty, limited English proficient students, and highly
- 17 mobile students according to the plan developed by the coordinator
- 18 pursuant to section 79-11,150.
- 19 Sec. 5. Section 79-1201, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 20 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 21 79-1201 Sections 79-1201 to 79-1249 and section 7 of this
- 22 <u>act</u>shall be known and may be cited as the Educational Service Units
- 23 Act.
- Sec. 6. Section 79-1202, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 25 Nebraska, is amended to read:

79-1202 The official name of each educational service 1 2 unit shall be Educational Service Unit No. ... of the State of Nebraska, and the individual number of each unit shall be determined 3 by the State Board of Education. For educational service units 4 5 existing on January 1, 1998, July 1, 2011, the number of the unit shall remain the same. For educational service units created by 6 7 merger, the number of the unit shall be the number of one of the 8 educational service units dissolving into the new educational service unit. For all other newly created educational service units, the 9 10 number shall be any number not otherwise assigned to an existing educational service unit. 11 12 Sec. 7. (1) Beginning July 1, 2011, educational service 13 units shall not serve or encompass within their boundaries any school <u>district designated as a Class IV or Class V district.</u> 14 15 (2) Consistent with subsection (1) of this section, the State Board of Education shall adjust the boundaries of any 16 educational service unit that has a Class IV or Class V district 17 within such educational service unit's boundaries prior to July 1, 18 2011. Such boundary adjustments shall align the boundaries of an 19 20 educational service unit to the boundaries of the remaining member 21 school districts. Any educational service unit that serves only a 22 Class IV or Class V district shall be dissolved. 23 (3) If an educational service unit is dissolved pursuant

to subsection (2) of this section, the Class IV or Class V district

previously served by such educational service unit shall succeed to

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1 all the property, contracts, and obligations of such educational

- 2 service unit and shall assume all of such educational service unit's
- 3 <u>valid contracts and obligations.</u>
- 4 (4) Beginning July 1, 2011, no educational service unit
- 5 that consists of only one member school district shall be formed.
- 6 Sec. 8. Section 79-1217, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 7 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:
- 8 79-1217 (1) All educational service units shall be governed by a board to be known as the Board of Educational Service 9 10 Unit No. Until the first Thursday after the first Tuesday in 11 January 2009, the educational service unit board, except the board of 12 an educational service unit with only one member school district, 13 shall be composed of one member from each county and four members at large, all of whom shall reside within the geographical boundaries of 14 15 the educational service unit, but no more than two of the members at 16 large shall be appointed or elected from the same county unless any 17 one county within the educational service unit has a population in 18 excess of one hundred fifty thousand inhabitants or the educational 19 service unit consists of only one county. Beginning on the first 20 Thursday after the first Tuesday in January 2009, the The educational 21 service unit board, except the board of an educational service unit 22 with only one member school district, shall be composed of one member elected to represent each election district established pursuant to 23 section 79-1217.01. Successors to the members initially appointed 24 pursuant to section 79-1212 shall be elected pursuant to section 25

- 2 (2) Vacancies in office shall occur as set forth in
- 3 section 32-560, except as otherwise provided in section 79-1212
- 4 regarding the requirement to live in the district represented, or in
- 5 the case of absences, unless excused by a majority of the remaining
- 6 members of the board, when a member is absent from the geographical
- 7 boundaries of the educational service unit for a continuous period of
- 8 sixty days at one time or from more than two consecutive regular
- 9 meetings of the board. Whenever any vacancy occurs on the board, the
- 10 remaining members of such board shall appoint an individual residing
- 11 within the election district of the educational service unit for
- 12 which the vacancy exists and meeting the qualifications for the
- 13 office to fill such vacancy for the balance of the unexpired term.
- 14 (3) Members of the board shall receive no compensation
- 15 for their services but shall be reimbursed for the actual and
- 16 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties under
- 17 the Educational Service Units Act as provided in sections 81-1174 to
- 18 81-1177.
- 19 (4) Except as provided in subsection (5) of this section,
- 20 any joint school district located in two or more counties shall be
- 21 considered a part of the educational service unit in which the
- 22 greater number of school-age children of such joint school district
- 23 reside.
- 24 (5) Any Class I district which is part of a Class VI
- 25 district shall be considered a part of the educational service unit

of which the Class VI district is a member. If the Class VI district 1 2 has removed itself from an educational service unit, each Class I district which is part of such Class VI district may continue its 3 existing membership in an educational service unit or may change its 4 5 status relative to membership in an educational service unit in accordance with section 79-1209. The patrons of a Class I district 6 7 maintaining membership in an educational service unit pursuant to 8 this subsection shall have the same rights and privileges as other patrons of the educational service unit, and the taxable valuation of 9 10 the taxable property within the geographic boundaries of such Class I district shall be subject to the educational service unit's tax levy 11

13 (6) The administrator of each educational service unit, prior to July 1 of each year in which a statewide primary election is 14 15 to be held, shall certify to the election commissioner or county 16 clerk of each county located within the unit the corporate name of each school district, as described in section 79-405, located within 17 the county. If a school district is a joint school district located 18 in two or more counties, the administrator shall certify to each 19 20 election commissioner or county clerk the educational service unit of which the school district is considered to be a part. 21

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22 (7) Educational service units with only one member school
23 district shall be governed by the school board of such school
24 district.

25 Sec. 9. Section 79-1217.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 1 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 2 79-1217.01 By December 31, 2007, and after each decennial
- 3 census pursuant to section 32-553, each educational service unit
- 4 board, except boards of educational service units with only one
- 5 member school district, shall divide the territory of the educational
- 6 service unit into at least five and up to twelve numbered districts
- 7 for the purpose of electing members to the board in compliance with
- 8 section 32-553. Such districts shall be compact and contiguous and
- 9 substantially equal in population. The newly established election
- 10 districts shall apply beginning with the nomination and election of
- 11 educational service unit board members in 2008.
- 12 Sec. 10. Section 79-1225, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 13 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 14 79-1225 (1)—After the adoption of its budget statement,
- 15 the board for each educational service unit, except as provided in
- 16 subsection (2) of this section, may levy a tax in the amount which it
- 17 requires under its adopted budget statement to be received from
- 18 taxation. The levy shall be subject to the limits established by
- 19 section 77-3442. The amount of such levy shall be certified by the
- 20 secretary of the educational service unit board to the county board
- 21 of equalization of each county in which any part of the geographical
- 22 area of the educational service unit is located on or before
- 23 September 20 of each year. Such tax shall be levied and assessed in
- 24 the same manner as other property taxes and entered on the books of
- 25 the county treasurer. The proceeds of such tax, as collected, shall

1 be remitted to the treasurer of the board on or before the fifteenth

- 2 day of each month or more frequently as provided in section 77-1759.
- 3 (2) For fiscal year 2013-14 and each fiscal year
- 4 thereafter, only an educational service unit which has two or more
- 5 member school districts may levy a tax on the taxable value of the
- 6 taxable property within the geographic boundaries of the educational
- 7 service unit.
- 8 Sec. 11. Section 79-2104.02, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 9 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:
- 10 79-2104.02 Each learning community coordinating council
- 11 shall use any funds received after January 15, 2011, pursuant to
- 12 section 79-1241.03 for evaluation and research pursuant to plans
- 13 developed by the learning community coordinating council with
- 14 assistance from the educational service unit coordinating council and
- 15 the student achievement coordinator and adjusted on an ongoing basis.
- 16 The evaluation shall be conducted by one or more other entities or
- 17 individuals who are not employees of the learning community and shall
- 18 measure progress toward the goals and objectives of the learning
- 19 community, which goals and objectives shall include closing academic
- 20 achievement gaps based on socioeconomic status, and the effectiveness
- 21 of the approaches used by the learning community or pilot project to
- 22 reach such goals and objectives. Any research conducted pursuant to
- 23 this section shall also be related to such goals and objectives.
- 24 After the first full year of operation, each learning community shall
- 25 report evaluation and research results to the Education Committee of

- 1 the Legislature on or before December 1 of each year.
- 2 Sec. 12. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2011.
- 3 Sec. 13. Original sections 32-515, 79-748, 79-760.04,
- 4 79-760.05, 79-1201, 79-1202, 79-1217.01, and 79-1225, Reissue Revised
- 5 Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 79-1217 and 79-2104.02, Revised
- 6 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010, are repealed.
- 7 Sec. 14. The following sections are outright repealed:
- 8 Sections 79-11,150, 79-1501, 79-1503, and 79-1504, Reissue Revised
- 9 Statutes of Nebraska.
- 10 Sec. 15. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 11 when passed and approved according to law.
