A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Ground Water Management and
2	Protection Act; to amend section 46-717, Reissue Revised
3	Statutes of Nebraska; to provide for standing for certain
4	parties with respect to proceedings affecting integrated
5	management plans as prescribed; and to repeal the
6	original section.
7	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 46-717, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 46-717 (1) In developing an integrated management plan, Department of Natural Resources and the affected natural 4 5 resources districts shall utilize the best scientific data and other information available and shall review and consider any rules and 6 7 regulations in effect in any existing ground water management area 8 that encompasses all or part of the geographic area to be encompassed by the plan. Consideration shall be given to the applicable 9 scientific data and other information relied upon by the department 10 in preparing the annual report required by section 46-713 and to 11 12 other types of data and information that may be deemed appropriate by 13 the department. The department, after seeking input from the affected natural resources districts, shall specify by rule and regulation the 14 15 types of scientific data and other information that will be 16 considered in developing an integrated management plan. The natural resources districts shall adopt similar rules and regulations 17 specifying the types of scientific data and other information 18 necessary for purposes of this section. Existing research, data, 19 20 studies, or any other relevant information which has been compiled by 21 or is in possession of other state or federal agencies, other natural resources districts, and other political subdivisions within the 22 23 State of Nebraska shall be utilized. State agencies and political subdivisions shall furnish information or data upon request of the 24 25 department or any affected natural resources district. Neither the

1 department nor the natural resources districts shall be required to

- 2 conduct new research or to develop new computer models to prepare an
- 3 integrated management plan, but such new research may be conducted or
- 4 new computer models developed within the limits of available funding
- 5 if the additional information is desired by the department or the
- 6 affected natural resources districts.
- 7 (2) During preparation of an integrated management plan
- 8 for a fully appropriated river basin, subbasin, or reach or of an
- 9 integrated management plan under subdivision (1)(b) of section
- 10 46-715, the department and the affected natural resources districts
- 11 shall consult with any irrigation district, reclamation district,
- 12 public power and irrigation district, mutual irrigation company,
- 13 canal company, or municipality that relies on water from the affected
- 14 river basin, subbasin, or reach and with other water users and
- 15 stakeholders as deemed appropriate by the department or by the
- 16 affected natural resources districts. They shall also actively
- 17 solicit public comments and opinions through public meetings and
- 18 other means.
- 19 (3) If any irrigation district, reclamation district,
- 20 public power and irrigation district, mutual irrigation company,
- 21 canal company, or municipality is the owner of an appropriation that
- 22 relies on water from an affected river basin, subbasin, or reach that
- 23 <u>is included in an integrated management plan, such irrigation</u>
- 24 <u>district</u>, reclamation district, public power and irrigation district,
- 25 <u>mutual irrigation company, canal company, or municipality shall have</u>

1 standing to participate in any legal or administrative proceedings

- 2 <u>affecting such integrated management plan.</u>
