A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Political Accountability and
2 Disclosure Act; to amend section 49-1446.02, Reissue
3 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to prohibit certain
4 expenditures for personal services performed by holders
5 of elective office; to repeal the original section; and
6 to declare an emergency.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 49-1446.02, Reissue Revised Statutes
2 of Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 49-1446.02 Notwithstanding any other provision of the
4 Nebraska Political Accountability and Disclosure Act, no committee
5 shall expend funds for the purchase or payment of:

6 (1) Clothes or medical or dental expenses of a candidate
7 or the members of his or her immediate family;

8 (2) Installment payments for an automobile owned by a
9 candidate;

10 (3) Mortgage or rental payments for a permanent residence
11 of a candidate;

12 (4) The satisfaction of personal debts, including
13 installment payments on personal loans, except campaign loans subject
14 to reporting required by subsection (2) of section 49-1456;

15 (5) Personal services, including the services of a lawyer
16 or accountant, except that this subdivision does not prohibit
17 expenditures for personal services for campaign services subject to
18 reporting pursuant to the provisions of section 49-1455 unless the
19 personal services are performed by the holder of an elective office;

20 or

21 (6) Office supplies, staff, or furnishings for the public
22 office for which an individual is a candidate for nomination or
23 election except as set out in subsection (2) of section 49-1446.01.

24 Sec. 2. Original section 49-1446.02, Reissue Revised
25 Statutes of Nebraska, is repealed.

1 Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
2 when passed and approved according to law.
