LB 267 provides that a person on probation, parole, work release or who is an inmate of any jail, correctional or penal facility is prohibited from acting as an undercover agent or employee of any law enforcement agency or political subdivision of the state.

LB 267 also provides that any evidence derived in violation of this section is not admissible against any person in any proceeding.
