Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 298 would make the following changes to sections 28-405 (Controlled substances; schedules; enumerated.) and 28-416 (Prohibited acts; violations; penalties.) of the Nebraska Revised Statutes, which Sections in the following manner:

Section 1. Amends 28-405 (Controlled substances; schedules; enumerated.)

Adds the following compound to subsection (25) (B) through (H) of this section "cyanoalkyl, 1-(N-methyl-2-piperidinyl)methyl, 1-(N-methyl-2-pyrrolidinyl)methyl 1-(N-methyl-3-morpholinyl)methyl, or tetrahydropyranylmethyl group";

Adds the following substances and or their compounds to the schedule I section of the Controlled Substances List: Adamantoylindoles;

Tetramethylcyclopropanoylindoles; Adamantylindole carboxamides; Adds phenethylamine and tryptamine or any material, compounds, mixture or preparation containing either compound to the Schedule I drug list.

Section 2. Amends 28-416 (Prohibited acts; violations; penalties.) to add reference to subsection (c) 25 to subsection (3) and (13) of this section.

In order to be classified as a Schedule I drug under federal law, the following must be found: The drug or other substance must have a high potential for abuse. The drug or other substance has no currently accepted medical use in treatment in the United States.

There is a lack of accepted safety for use of the drug or other substance under medical supervision.

No prescriptions may be written for Schedule I substances, and such substances are subject to production quotas by the DEA.
