Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Legislative Bill 645 would add reporting requirements for fall personnel reports and would modify the teacher education allowance beginning with the calculation of aid for the 2013-14 school fiscal year.

Section 79-804 would be amended by adding requirements to the fall personnel report filed by public private, denominational, and parochial schools. For all individuals employed by the school who are required to hold a certificate, the proposal would require the reporting of the salaries, years of experience, benefits, certificate level, postsecondary education degree level, hours of postsecondary education, and highest degree level attained. For instructional paraprofessionals, the reporting of salary, benefits, years of experience, and educational level would also be required.

Section 79-1007.25 would be amended by revising the calculation of the teacher education allowance beginning with the calculation of aid for the 2013-14 school fiscal year. The allowance would be based on certificated teachers assigned to teach classes in the subject area or field of their degree and weighted as follows:

- 1. Holding a baccalaureate degree and assigned to teach classes in the same subject field of his or her degree weighted as 1.00;
- 2. Holding a baccalaureate degree with 9 additional credit hours of postsecondary education weighted as 1.05;
- 3. Holding a baccalaureate degree with 18 additional credit hours of postsecondary education weighted as 1.10;
- 4. Holding a baccalaureate degree with 27 additional credit hours of postsecondary education weighted as 1.15;
- 5. Holding a master's degree weighted as 1.20;

- 6. Holding a master's degree with 9 additional credit hours of postsecondary education weighted as 1.25;
- 7. Holding a master's degree with 18 additional credit hours of postsecondary education weighted as 1.30;
- 8. Holding a master's degree with 27 additional credit hours of postsecondary education weighted as 1.35;
- 9. Holding a master's degree with 36 additional credit hours of postsecondary education weighted as 1.40; and
- 10. Holding a doctorate degree weighted as 1.45.
