Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

This bill would create the offense of disarming a peace officer, and makes the offense a Class III felony (Maximum — twenty years imprisonment, or twenty-five thousand dollars fine, or both; Minimum — one year imprisonment).

During the 2013 Legislative Session, the Nebraska Department of Correctional Services (DCS) stated that this bill will have an indeterminate fiscal impact, and the bill's impact on future admissions is not determinable.

The provisions of this bill could impact state and local criminal justice resources (courts, law enforcement, prosecutors, public defenders, probation, prisons, and jails). It is unknown how many individuals would violate the provisions of this bill, and therefore, it will have an indeterminate impact on criminal justice expenditures. Additionally, any fines assessed pursuant to convictions will accrue to the county where the violation occurs to be used for the support of public schools.

The FY13 per diem for an individual inmate was \$6,422 per year. This is the cost for food, medical care, inmate wages, clothing, cleaning supplies, food service supplies, cell and dorm supplies, other supplies, and transportation.

As of October 31, 2013, the inmate population was 150.61% of design capacity.
