**Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.**

This bill designates the Department of Health and Human Services as the agency with primary responsibility for coordination, oversight and implementation of all state functions in matters concerning the presence, effects, measurement and mitigation of risks of radon. Beginning January 2014, all new residential construction must include radon resistance construction. The Radon-Resistant Building Codes Task Force is established. The task force is to make recommendations by December 14, 2014 and terminates on January 1, 2015.

The estimated cost of the task force is \$8,000 General Funds in FY 14. If HHS is required to inspect new construction for compliance additional staff and operating costs would be required. Additional clarification is needed on the role the agency regulation and enforcement.

Explanation of Estimate: Program 033

LB 13 would require all new residential construction in Nebraska to include radon resistant features beginning Jan 1, 2014. It would also create a task force to make recommendations to the Governor and DHHS about rules and regulations requiring residential building codes to include Radon Resistant New Construction (RRNC).

The cost of the Task Force would be \$7,985. Additional clarification of the Department's role would be necessary to fully determine what additional fiscal impact, if any, would result from this legislation.
