1	FOR AN ACT relating to education; to amend section 85-932.01, Reissue
2	Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 79-777 and
3	85-1540, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2012; to
4	change provisions relating to career academies; to create
5	a fund; to provide for and change provisions relating to
6	grants as prescribed; to redefine a term; and to repeal
7	the original sections.
8	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 79-777, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:
- 3 79-777 (1) Any A school district or a consortium, with
- 4 the approval of the State Department of Education, may establish and
- 5 operate a career academy. A consortium shall consist of not fewer
- 6 than three school districts and a community college or a publicly
- 7 funded four-year college or university. At least one other public
- 8 agency, private business, private-industry group, or other privately
- 9 <u>funded entity shall participate in the consortium.</u> The purpose of a
- 10 career academy is to provide students with a career-based educational
- 11 curriculum in at least grades eleven and twelve and may provide such
- 12 <u>career-based curriculum to students in grades nine and ten</u>. A school
- 13 district may partner with another school district, an educational
- 14 service unit, a learning community, a postsecondary educational
- 15 institution, or a private entity in the establishment and operation
- 16 of a career academy.
- 17 (2) A consortium described in subsection (1) of this
- 18 section shall enter into an interlocal agreement pursuant to the
- 19 Interlocal Cooperation Act. Such interlocal agreement shall:
- 20 <u>(a) Provide for a governing board of directors and the</u>
- 21 membership thereof; and
- 22 (b) Determine which publicly funded participant in the
- 23 agreement will have charge of the funds of the career academy. Such
- 24 funds shall be subject to all the same requirements of approval,
- 25 <u>audits, and budgeting as a school district in the State of Nebraska.</u>

1 $\frac{(2)-(3)}{2}$ A career academy established pursuant to

- 2 subsection (1) of this section shall:
- 3 (a) Recruit students who seek a career-based curriculum,
- 4 which curriculum shall be based on criteria determined by the
- 5 department;
- 6 (b) Recruit and hire instructors based on their expertise
- 7 in career-based education; and
- 8 (c) Provide a rigorous academic curriculum with a
- 9 transition component to prepare students for the workforce,
- 10 including, but not limited to, internships, job training, and skills
- 11 training.
- 12 <u>(c) Provide a rigorous educational program that focuses</u>
- 13 on career clusters as described in the Nebraska Career Education
- 14 Programs of Study published by the State Department of Education and
- on high-demand careers as determined by the Department of Labor. The
- 16 program shall include, but not be limited to:
- 17 (i) Workplace skills, basic skills related to career
- 18 pathways, technology, specific career or job skills, job shadowing,
- 19 and internships;
- 20 (ii) Assessment and counseling as determined by the State
- 21 <u>Department of Education; and</u>
- 22 <u>(iii) An advisory board for each career cluster to</u>
- 23 provide input on skills and knowledge needed for employment.
- 24 (4) All expenses and revenue of a school district
- 25 relating to a career academy shall be exempt from budget and

1 expenditure limitations, up to the total amount received as grants

- 2 under subsection (5) of this section.
- 3 (5) For each full-time equivalent student enrolled in a
- 4 career academy sponsored by a consortium, the resident school
- 5 district of such student shall receive a grant of one thousand five
- 6 hundred dollars per school year from funds available to the career
- 7 <u>education division of the State Department of Education. If there are</u>
- 8 not sufficient funds available to fully fund such grant for each
- 9 <u>eligible student</u>, all grants under this section shall be prorated
- 10 such that each eligible student receives the same amount of funds.
- 11 (3) In addition to funding from the establishing school
- 12 district or any of the district's partners, a (6) A career academy
- 13 may also receive private donations for operating expenses.
- 14 $\frac{(4)}{(7)}$ The department shall define standards and
- 15 criteria for (a) the establishment, evaluation, and continuing
- 16 approval of career academies, (b) career-based curriculum utilized by
- 17 career academies, (c) the necessary data elements and collection of
- 18 data pertaining to career academies, including, but not limited to,
- 19 the number of students enrolled in a career academy and their grade
- 20 levels, and (d) the establishment of advisory boards consisting of
- 21 business and education representatives to provide guidance and
- 22 direction for the operation of career academies.
- 23 (5) (8) The State Board of Education may adopt and
- 24 promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this section.
- 25 Sec. 2. (1) The Industry Credential Assessment Fund is

created. The fund shall consist of money appropriated by the 1 Legislature and funds contributed pursuant to this section by private 2 3 businesses, private-industry groups, or other privately funded 4 entities for the purpose of defraying the cost to graduates of a 5 career academy established under section 79-777 of an assessment to obtain an industry-recognized credential. The fund shall be 6 7 administered by the State Department of Education. The department 8 shall separately account for funds appropriated by the Legislature 9 and funds contributed by private businesses, private-industry groups, 10 or other privately funded entities. A private business, privateindustry group, or other privately funded entity may specify the 11 12 career field its contributions may be used to assist. Any money in 13 the fund available for investment shall be invested by the state 14 investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and 15 the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. 16 (2) A student who completes a course of study in a career 17 academy may apply to the State Department of Education to request 18 assistance, in an amount not to exceed one thousand dollars, to 19 defray the cost of an assessment required to obtain an industry-20 recognized credential related to the course of study which he or she 21 has completed in the career academy. The department shall provide 22 application forms and shall make a timely decision to grant or not grant each request. The department shall notify each applicant of its 23 24 decision. 25 (3) For each request granted by the department, one-half

1 of the amount of the grant shall be taken from funds appropriated by

- 2 the Legislature and one-half of such amount from funds contributed by
- 3 private businesses, private-industry groups, or other privately
- 4 funded entities. If a private business, private-industry group, or
- 5 other privately funded entity has specified a career field as
- 6 provided in subsection (1) of this section, the department shall fund
- 7 the grant accordingly.
- 8 (4) If an applicant fails to earn the industry-recognized
- 9 credential after twice taking and failing the assessment therefor, no
- 10 <u>further applications from such applicant shall be accepted by the</u>
- 11 department.

- 13 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 14 85-932.01 Foundations education shall mean education
- 15 which includes remedial and developmental programs, adult basic
- 16 education, general education development, English as a second
- 17 language, compensatory education, career academies established by a
- 18 <u>consortium pursuant to section 79-777</u> and refresher courses.
- 19 Sec. 4. Section 85-1540, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 20 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:
- 21 85-1540 (1) There is hereby created the Nebraska
- 22 Community College Student Performance and Occupational Education
- 23 Grant Fund. The fund shall be under the direction of the Nebraska
- 24 Community College Student Performance and Occupational Education
- 25 Grant Committee. The fund shall contain any amount available for

1 transfer pursuant to subdivision (2) of section 85-2234 and such

- 2 other amounts as may be transferred or otherwise accrue to the fund.
- 3 The fund shall be used to provide aid or grants to the community
- 4 colleges for (a) applied technology and occupational faculty
- 5 training, instructional equipment upgrades, employee assessment,
- 6 preemployment training, employment training, and dislocated worker
- 7 programs benefiting the State of Nebraska or (b) programs or
- 8 activities to enhance (i) student performance in the areas of degree,
- 9 certificate, or diploma completion, retention, or foundations
- 10 education as defined in section 85-932.01, or (ii) the collection,
- 11 reporting, analysis, and utilization of student data, and (iii)
- 12 <u>career academies established by a consortium pursuant to section</u>
- $13 \quad 79-777$. Any money in the fund available for investment shall be
- 14 invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska
- 15 Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 16 (2) Applications for aid or grants pursuant to this
- 17 section may be submitted by a community college area independently or
- 18 in collaboration with other community college areas.
