Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Sec. 1. increases the minimum wage for people paid by tips. Currently, those individuals are paid cash wages at a minimum rate of \$2.13 an hour. LB 1089 increases the wages paid beginning August 1, 2016 to 40% of the standard minimum wage in effect, which is currently \$9.00 an hour. Effectively, the tipped minimum wage beginning August 1, 2016 would be \$3.60 an hour.

Beginning January 1, 2017, the tipped minimum wage equals 50% of the standard minimum wage in effect. Effectively, the tipped minimum wage beginning January 1, 2017 would be \$4.50 an hour.

Sec. 2. requires employers subject to the Wage and Hour Act to post minimum wage amounts in effect with such information furnished by the commissioner without charge.

Sec. 3. repealer.

Sec. 4. includes an emergency clause.
