Summary of purpose and/or changes:

The bill was introduced on behalf of the Nebraska Optometric Association to update statutes to ensure new technology to examine ocular health has oversight from the health profession.

Section-by-section description:

Section (1): Creates the Consumer Protection in Eye Care Act

Section (2): Defines terms for purposes of this Act

Section (3): Requires a valid prescription in order to dispense contacts or glasses (excluding over the counter glasses)

Section (4): Sets out requirements relating to kiosks

Section (5): Over the counter glasses can not be greater than 3.25 diopters of uniform focus power

Section (6): Sets out procedures for violations, investigations, and civil penalties. Allows the Attorney General to file civil actions or enforce the rules at the request of the Department.

Section (7): Allows DHHS to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this Act
