## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB504 would amend 29-2261 to require a copy of the presentence investigation (PSI) to be provided to defense counsel and the county attorney at least seven days before sentencing.

A prosecutor is already included in the category of "others entitled by law to receive" the information in the presentence investigation report, and a defendant may examine a PSI with his or her attorney, subject to the court's supervision and redaction of any confidential or privileged information. However, defense counsel is not entitled to receive a copy.

LB504 would require the court or probation to provide the PSI to defense counsel, but would still allow the court to order redaction of certain information upon a showing by a preponderance of the evidence that a redaction is "warranted in the interests of public safety".

## **Explanation of amendments:**

AM291 clarifies that the court can email the PSI to the defense counsel or prosecuting attorney; a hard copy is not required.
