## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Creates the Assisting Caregiver Transitions Act requiring hospitals to allow patients to designated a caregiver, to consult with the patient and caregiver on the discharge plan and aftercare instructions for the patient, and to document the instructions in the patient's medical record. The Act does not create a private right of action or create additional liability for a hospital, nor does it affect licensure of the facility, or reimbursement, or interfere with a valid health care power of attorney. Allows the Department of Health and Human Services to adopt rules and regulations.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

AM1878 to LB849 makes timelines more flexible, removes the requirement to notify upon nonemergency transfer, includes the patient's legal guardian for minors, removes requirement for hospital to maintain consent records, clarifies language, removes requirements for hospital to provide contact information, community resources and long-term services and supports to carry out the discharge plan.
