- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Uniform Credentialing Act; to amend section 38-2025, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, section 38-121, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014, and section 38-101, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015; to adopt the Surgical First Assistant Practice Act; to harmonize provisions; to provide an operative date; and to repeal the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 17 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the Surgical First Assistant Practice Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. The Legislature finds that:
- 4 (1) Surgical assisting is an established health profession in
- 5 Nebraska;
- 6 (2) Surgical first assistants aid in ensuring a safe surgical
- 7 environment by maximizing patient safety by using appropriate techniques
- 8 for processes, including, but not limited to, maintaining hemostasis,
- 9 proper patient positioning, clear visualization of the operative site,
- 10 proper closure of the operative site, and correct dressing of a wound;
- 11 <u>and</u>
- 12 (3) It is necessary to encourage the most effective utilization of
- 13 the skills of surgical first assistants by enabling them to perform tasks
- 14 <u>delegated by a licensed physician.</u>
- 15 Sec. 3. For purposes of the Surgical First Assistant Practice Act
- 16 and elsewhere in the Uniform Credentialing Act, unless the context
- 17 otherwise requires, the definitions found in sections 4 to 10 of this act
- 18 <u>apply.</u>
- 19 Sec. 4. <u>Approved certifying body means a national certification</u>
- 20 organization which is approved by the board, certifies qualified surgical
- 21 first assistants, has eligibility requirements related to education and
- 22 practice, and offers an examination in an area of practice which meets
- 23 guidelines and tests approved by the board.
- 24 Sec. 5. Approved surgical first assistant education program means a
- 25 program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health
- 26 <u>Education Programs or the Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools</u>
- or other accreditation entity approved by the board.
- Sec. 6. Board means the Board of Medicine and Surgery.
- 29 Sec. 7. <u>Licensed surgical first assistant means a person licensed</u>
- 30 to practice surgical assisting under the Surgical First Assistant
- 31 Practice Act.

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1 Sec. 8. Personal supervision by a physician means the physical

- 2 <u>attendance of a physician in the room during the performance of a</u>
- 3 <u>surgical procedure.</u>
- 4 Sec. 9. Surgical assisting means the practice of promoting patient
- 5 <u>safety through provision of primary assistance to the primary surgeon</u>
- 6 during a surgical procedure.
- 7 Sec. 10. <u>Surgical first assistant means a person who meets the</u>
- 8 <u>requirements of section 12 of this act.</u>
- 9 Sec. 11. A licensed surgical first assistant may engage in the
- 10 practice of surgical assisting, including, but not limited to, the
- 11 <u>following:</u>
- 12 <u>(1) Assisting in the intraoperative care of a surgical patient;</u>
- 13 (2) Positioning the patient;
- 14 (3) Preparing and draping the patient for the surgical procedure;
- 15 (4) Providing visualization of the operative site;
- 16 (5) Assisting with hemostasis;
- 17 (6) Assisting with closure of body planes, including the following:
- 18 <u>(a) Inserting running or interrupted subcutaneous sutures with</u>
- 19 <u>absorbable or nonabsorbable material;</u>
- 20 <u>(b) Utilizing subcuticular closure technique with or without</u>
- 21 <u>adhesive skin closure strips; and</u>
- (c) Closing skin with method indicated by surgeon, including, but
- 23 not limited to, suture and staples;
- 24 (7) Applying appropriate wound dressings;
- 25 (8) Providing assistance in securing drainage systems to tissue;
- 26 (9) Preparing specimens, such as grafts; and
- 27 (10) Performing other tasks during a surgical procedure delegated by
- 28 and under the personal supervision of a physician appropriate to the
- 29 level of competence of the surgical first assistant.
- 30 Sec. 12. (1) An applicant for licensure under the Surgical First
- 31 Assistant Practice Act shall:

- 1 (a) Be certified as a surgical first assistant by an approved
- 2 certifying body;
- 3 (b) Have successfully completed an approved surgical first assistant
- 4 education program approved by the board or other experiential or training
- 5 program as approved by the board;
- 6 (c) Have passed a nationally recognized surgical first assistant
- 7 examination adopted by the board; and
- 8 (d) Have a high school diploma or the equivalent as determined by
- 9 the board.
- 10 (2) The department may waive the education and examination
- 11 <u>requirements under the Surgical First Assistant Practice Act for an</u>
- 12 <u>applicant who:</u>
- 13 (a) By January 1, 2017, submits demonstrated evidence satisfactory
- 14 to the board that he or she has been functioning as a surgical first
- 15 <u>assistant as his or her primary function in a licensed health care</u>
- 16 facility within the last five years prior to September 1, 2016;
- 17 <u>(b) By January 1, 2017, submits evidence of holding a current</u>
- 18 certification as a surgical first assistant issued by an approved
- 19 <u>certifying body; or</u>
- 20 <u>(c) Submits evidence of holding a credential as a surgical first</u>
- 21 assistant issued by another state or territory of the United States or
- 22 the District of Columbia which has standards substantially equivalent to
- 23 those of this state.
- 24 Sec. 13. The Surgical First Assistant Practice Act shall not be
- 25 construed to:
- 26 <u>(1) Prohibit any nurse practitioner, registered nurse, physician, or</u>
- 27 physician assistant credentialed to practice under the Uniform
- 28 <u>Credentialing Act from engaging in the practice for which he or she is</u>
- 29 <u>credentialed; or</u>
- 30 (2) Prohibit any student enrolled in a bona fide surgical first
- 31 assistant training program recognized by the board from performing those

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1 duties which are necessary for the student's course of study, if the

- 2 <u>duties are performed under the personal supervision of a physician.</u>
- 3 Sec. 14. A person holding an active license as a licensed certified
- 4 surgical first assistant has the right to use the title licensed surgical
- 5 first assistant and the abbreviation L.S.F.A.
- 6 Sec. 15. The department shall establish and collect fees for
- 7 initial licensure and renewal under the Surgical First Assistant Practice
- 8 Act as provided in sections 38-151 to 38-157.
- 9 Sec. 16. <u>A licensed surgical first assistant shall perform</u>
- 10 delegated functions only under the personal supervision of a physician.
- 11 Sec. 17. (1) The board shall, pursuant to section 38-126: (a)
- 12 Recommend to the department the issuance of licenses to practice surgical
- 13 <u>assisting under the Surgical First Assistant Practice Act; (b)</u>
- 14 <u>investigate and adopt standards based on national standards for surgical</u>
- 15 assisting and implement changes as needed to carry out the act; and (c)
- 16 provide for distribution of information regarding practice of licensed
- 17 surgical first assistants.
- 18 (2) The department shall: (a) Receive and investigate complaints,
- 19 conduct hearings, and impose disciplinary actions in relation to
- 20 complaints against licensed surgical first assistants under the Uniform
- 21 Credentialing Act; and (b) perform other duties as required under the
- 22 Surgical First Assistant Practice Act and Uniform Credentialing Act.
- 23 Sec. 18. Section 38-101, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015, is
- 24 amended to read:
- 25 38-101 Sections 38-101 to 38-1,141 and the following practice acts
- 26 shall be known and may be cited as the Uniform Credentialing Act:
- 27 (1) The Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Practice Act;
- 28 (2) The Alcohol and Drug Counseling Practice Act;
- 29 (3) The Athletic Training Practice Act;
- 30 (4) The Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology Practice Act;
- 31 (5) The Certified Nurse Midwifery Practice Act;

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1 If there is any conflict between any provision of sections 38-101 to

- 2 38-1,139 and 38-1,141 and any provision of a practice act, the provision
- 3 of the practice act shall prevail.
- 4 The Revisor of Statutes shall assign the Uniform Credentialing Act,
- 5 including the practice acts enumerated in subdivisions (1) through (33)
- 6 of this section, to articles within Chapter 38.

- 9 38-121 (1) No individual shall engage in the following practices
- 10 unless such individual has obtained a credential under the Uniform
- 11 Credentialing Act:
- 12 (a) Acupuncture;
- 13 (b) Advanced practice nursing;
- 14 (c) Alcohol and drug counseling;
- (d) Asbestos abatement, inspection, project design, and training;
- 16 (e) Athletic training;
- 17 (f) Audiology;
- 18 (g) Speech-language pathology;
- 19 (h) Body art;
- 20 (i) Chiropractic;
- 21 (j) Cosmetology;
- 22 (k) Dentistry;
- 23 (1) Dental hygiene;
- 24 (m) Electrology;
- 25 (n) Emergency medical services;
- 26 (o) Esthetics;
- 27 (p) Funeral directing and embalming;
- 28 (q) Genetic counseling;
- 29 (r) Hearing instrument dispensing and fitting;

1 (3) No business shall operate for the provision of any of the

- 2 following services unless such business has obtained a credential under
- 3 the Uniform Credentialing Act:
- 4 (a) Body art;
- 5 (b) Cosmetology;
- 6 (c) Emergency medical services;
- 7 (d) Esthetics;
- 8 (e) Funeral directing and embalming;
- 9 (f) Massage therapy; or
- 10 (g) Nail technology.
- 11 Sec. 20. Section 38-2025, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 12 amended to read:
- 13 38-2025 The following classes of persons shall not be construed to
- 14 be engaged in the unauthorized practice of medicine:
- 15 (1) Persons rendering gratuitous services in cases of emergency;
- 16 (2) Persons administering ordinary household remedies;
- 17 (3) The members of any church practicing its religious tenets,
- 18 except that they shall not prescribe or administer drugs or medicines,
- 19 perform surgical or physical operations, nor assume the title of or hold
- 20 themselves out to be physicians, and such members shall not be exempt
- 21 from the quarantine laws of this state;
- 22 (4) Students of medicine who are studying in an accredited school or
- 23 college of medicine and who gratuitously prescribe for and treat disease
- 24 under the supervision of a licensed physician;
- 25 (5) Physicians who serve in the armed forces of the United States or
- 26 the United States Public Health Service or who are employed by the United
- 27 States Department of Veterans Affairs or other federal agencies, if their
- 28 practice is limited to that service or employment;
- 29 (6) Physicians who are licensed in good standing to practice
- 30 medicine under the laws of another state when incidentally called into
- 31 this state or contacted via electronic or other medium for consultation

- 1 with a physician licensed in this state. For purposes of this
- 2 subdivision, consultation means evaluating the medical data of the
- 3 patient as provided by the treating physician and rendering a
- 4 recommendation to such treating physician as to the method of treatment
- 5 or analysis of the data. The interpretation of a radiological image by a
- 6 physician who specializes in radiology is not a consultation;
- 7 (7) Physicians who are licensed in good standing to practice
- 8 medicine in another state but who, from such other state, order
- 9 diagnostic or therapeutic services on an irregular or occasional basis,
- 10 to be provided to an individual in this state, if such physicians do not
- 11 maintain and are not furnished for regular use within this state any
- 12 office or other place for the rendering of professional services or the
- 13 receipt of calls;
- 14 (8) Physicians who are licensed in good standing to practice
- 15 medicine in another state and who, on an irregular and occasional basis,
- 16 are granted temporary hospital privileges to practice medicine and
- 17 surgery at a hospital or other medical facility licensed in this state;
- 18 (9) Persons providing or instructing as to use of braces, prosthetic
- 19 appliances, crutches, contact lenses, and other lenses and devices
- 20 prescribed by a physician licensed to practice medicine while working
- 21 under the direction of such physician;
- 22 (10) Dentists practicing their profession when licensed and
- 23 practicing in accordance with the Dentistry Practice Act;
- 24 (11) Optometrists practicing their profession when licensed and
- 25 practicing under and in accordance with the Optometry Practice Act;
- 26 (12) Osteopathic physicians practicing their profession if licensed
- 27 and practicing under and in accordance with sections 38-2029 to 38-2033;
- 28 (13) Chiropractors practicing their profession if licensed and
- 29 practicing under the Chiropractic Practice Act;
- 30 (14) Podiatrists practicing their profession when licensed and
- 31 practicing under and in accordance with the Podiatry Practice Act;

- 1 (15) Psychologists practicing their profession when licensed and
- 2 practicing under and in accordance with the Psychology Practice Act;
- 3 (16) Advanced practice registered nurses practicing in their
- 4 clinical specialty areas when licensed under the Advanced Practice
- 5 Registered Nurse Practice Act and practicing under and in accordance with
- 6 their respective practice acts;
- 7 (17) Surgical first assistants practicing in accordance with the
- 8 Surgical First Assistant Practice Act;
- 9  $(18 ext{ } ext{47})$  Persons licensed or certified under the laws of this state
- 10 to practice a limited field of the healing art, not specifically named in
- 11 this section, when confining themselves strictly to the field for which
- 12 they are licensed or certified, not assuming the title of physician,
- 13 surgeon, or physician and surgeon, and not professing or holding
- 14 themselves out as qualified to prescribe drugs in any form or to perform
- 15 operative surgery;
- 16 (19 18) Persons obtaining blood specimens while working under an
- 17 order of or protocols and procedures approved by a physician, registered
- 18 nurse, or other independent health care practitioner licensed to practice
- 19 by the state if the scope of practice of that practitioner permits the
- 20 practitioner to obtain blood specimens; and
- 21 (20 + 9) Other trained persons employed by a licensed health care
- 22 facility or health care service defined in the Health Care Facility
- 23 Licensure Act or clinical laboratory certified pursuant to the federal
- 24 Clinical Laboratories Improvement Act of 1967, as amended, or Title XVIII
- 25 or XIX of the federal Social Security Act to withdraw human blood for
- 26 scientific or medical purposes.
- 27 Any person who has held or applied for a license to practice
- 28 medicine and surgery in this state, and such license or application has
- 29 been denied or such license has been refused renewal or disciplined by
- 30 order of limitation, suspension, or revocation, shall be ineligible for
- 31 the exceptions described in subdivisions (5) through (8) of this section

- 1 until such license or application is granted or such license is renewed
- 2 or reinstated. Every act or practice falling within the practice of
- 3 medicine and surgery as defined in section 38-2024 and not specially
- 4 excepted in this section shall constitute the practice of medicine and
- 5 surgery and may be performed in this state only by those licensed by law
- 6 to practice medicine in Nebraska.
- 7 Sec. 21. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2017.
