## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 1024**

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to conflicts of interest; to amend section
- 2 49-14,102, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to change a
- 3 provision relating to the value of a contract with a government body
- 4 as prescribed; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 49-14,102, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 2 Supplement, 2014, is amended to read:
- 3 49-14,102 (1) Except as otherwise provided by law, no public
- 4 official or public employee, a member of that individual's immediate
- 5 family, or business with which the individual is associated shall enter
- 6 into a contract valued at ten two thousand dollars or more, in any one
- 7 year, with a government body unless the contract is awarded through an
- 8 open and public process. Beginning on January 1, 2017, and each year
- 9 thereafter, the contract value amount shall be adjusted for inflation
- 10 based on an amount equal to the percentage change in the Consumer Price
- 11 <u>Index for All Urban Consumers as published by the Federal Bureau of Labor</u>
- 12 Statistics for the one-year period ending on the previous September 30.
- 13 Such amount shall be rounded to the next highest one-thousand-dollar
- 14 amount.
- 15 (2) For purposes of this section, an open and public process
- 16 includes prior public notice and subsequent availability for public
- 17 inspection during the regular office hours of the contracting government
- 18 body of the proposals considered and the contract awarded.
- 19 (3) No contract may be divided for the purpose of evading the
- 20 requirements of this section.
- 21 (4) This section shall not apply to a contract when the public
- 22 official or public employee does not in any way represent either party in
- 23 the transaction.
- 24 (5) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, any city of
- 25 the metropolitan, primary, or first class may prohibit contracts over a
- 26 specific dollar amount in which a public official or a public employee of
- 27 such city may have an interest.
- 28 (6) This section prohibits public officials and public employees
- 29 from engaging in certain activities under circumstances creating a
- 30 substantial conflict of interest. This section is not intended to
- 31 penalize innocent persons, and a contract shall not be absolutely void by

- 1 reason of this section.
- 2 (7) This section does not apply to contracts covered by sections
- 3 49-14,103.01 to 49-14,103.06.
