1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to children; to amend sections 79-1007.13 and 2 79-1119, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, sections 43-2511 and 3 43-2515, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014, and section 4 79-1018.01, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015; to state intent relating to grants for the Nebraska Whole Child Project; to change 5 6 provisions relating to medicaid in public schools and local system 7 formula resources; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the 8 original sections.

9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate
- 2 \$250,000 from the General Fund for fiscal year 2017-18 to the State
- 3 <u>Department of Education, for Program 158, to provide grants to the</u>
- 4 Nebraska Whole Child Project established as a joint entity under an
- 5 <u>agreement pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act.</u>
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 43-2511, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 7 2014, is amended to read:
- 8 43-2511 (1) There is hereby established a statewide billing system
- 9 for accessing federal medicaid funds for special education and related
- 10 services provided by school districts. The system shall apply to all
- 11 students verified with disabilities from date of diagnosis to twenty-one
- 12 years of age as allowed under the federal Medicare Catastrophic Coverage
- 13 Act of 1988. The system shall be developed, implemented, and administered
- 14 jointly by the Department of Health and Human Services and the State
- 15 Department of Education. On or before October 1, 2015, the Department of
- 16 Health and Human Services and the State Department of Education shall
- 17 jointly revise the statewide billing system to streamline and simplify
- 18 the claims process, to update reimbursement rates, and to incorporate
- 19 services included in the state plan amendment submitted pursuant to
- 20 subsection (4) of section 68-911. After the reimbursement rates have been
- 21 updated pursuant to this section, such rates shall be reviewed at least
- 22 once every five years. School districts, educational service units, or
- 23 approved cooperatives providing special education and related services
- 24 shall be required to participate in the statewide billing system. Eleven
- 25 and fifty-four hundredths percent of federal medicaid funds received by
- 26 school districts pursuant to such billing system shall be considered
- 27 reimbursement for the costs to school districts associated with the
- 28 implementation and administration of such a system, and such costs shall
- 29 be included in the medicaid reimbursement rates to be established for
- 30 each service.
- 31 (2) From the amount provided pursuant to section 43-2515 to aid in

- 1 carrying out the Early Intervention Act, the Department of Health and
- 2 Human Services shall retain, for the purposes of implementing and
- 3 administering the statewide billing system and early intervention
- 4 services coordination services, an amount equal to the lesser of the
- 5 actual cost of implementing and administering the statewide billing
- 6 system and early intervention services coordination services or (1) for
- 7 fiscal year 2014-15, two hundred forty-two thousand dollars, (2) for
- 8 fiscal year 2015-16, three hundred thousand dollars, or (3) for fiscal
- 9 year 2016-17 and each fiscal year thereafter, the amount retained for
- 10 such purposes for the prior year increased by five percent.
- 11 (3) For fiscal year 2017-18, from federal medicaid funds for special
- 12 <u>education and related services provided by school districts, the State</u>
- 13 Department of Education shall retain two hundred fifty thousand dollars
- 14 to provide grants to the Nebraska Whole Child Project established as a
- 15 joint entity under an agreement pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation
- 16 Act.
- 17 Sec. 3. Section 43-2515, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 18 2014, is amended to read:
- 19 43-2515 For years 1993 through 2015, on or before October 1, the
- 20 Department of Health and Human Services and the State Department of
- 21 Education shall jointly certify to the budget administrator of the budget
- 22 division of the Department of Administrative Services the amount of
- 23 federal medicaid funds paid to school districts pursuant to the Early
- 24 Intervention Act for special education services for children five years
- 25 of age and older for the immediately preceding fiscal year. The General
- 26 Fund appropriation to the State Department of Education for state special
- 27 education aid for the then-current fiscal year shall be decreased by an
- 28 amount equal to the amount that would have been reimbursed with state
- 29 general funds to the school districts through the special education
- 30 reimbursement process for special education services for children five
- 31 years of age and older that was paid to school districts or approved

- 1 cooperatives with federal medicaid funds.
- 2 For fiscal years through fiscal year 2015-16, it is the intent of
- 3 the Legislature that an amount equal to the amount that would have been
- 4 reimbursed with state general funds to the school districts, certified to
- 5 the budget administrator, be appropriated from the General Fund to aid in
- 6 carrying out the provisions of the Early Intervention Act and other
- 7 related early intervention services.
- 8 For 2015 and each year thereafter, on or before December 1, the
- 9 Department of Health and Human Services and the State Department of
- 10 Education shall jointly certify to the budget administrator of the budget
- 11 division of the Department of Administrative Services the aggregate
- 12 amount to be included in the local system formula resources pursuant to
- 13 subdivision (16) of section 79-1018.01 for all local systems for aid to
- 14 be calculated pursuant to the Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities
- 15 Support Act for the next school fiscal year.
- 16 For fiscal year 2016-17 and each fiscal year thereafter, it is the
- 17 intent of the Legislature that, in addition to other state and federal
- 18 funds used to carry out the Early Intervention Act, funds equal to the
- 19 lesser of the amount certified to the budget administrator or the amount
- 20 appropriated or transferred for such purposes pursuant to this section
- 21 for the immediately preceding fiscal year increased by five percent be
- 22 appropriated from the General Fund to aid in carrying out the provisions
- 23 of the Early Intervention Act and other related early intervention
- 24 services.
- 25 Sec. 4. Section 79-1007.13, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 26 amended to read:
- 27 79-1007.13 The department shall calculate a special receipts
- 28 allowance for each district equal to the amount of special education,
- 29 state ward, and accelerated or differentiated curriculum program receipts
- 30 included in local system formula resources under subdivisions (7), (8),
- 31 $\frac{\text{and}}{\text{(16)}}$, $\frac{\text{and}}{\text{(17)}}$ of section 79-1018.01 attributable to the school

- 1 district.
- 2 Sec. 5. Section 79-1018.01, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015, is
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 79-1018.01 Except as otherwise provided in this section, local
- 5 system formula resources include other actual receipts available for the
- 6 funding of general fund operating expenditures as determined by the
- 7 department for the second school fiscal year immediately preceding the
- 8 school fiscal year in which aid is to be paid. Other actual receipts
- 9 include:
- 10 (1) Public power district sales tax revenue;
- 11 (2) Fines and license fees;
- 12 (3) Tuition receipts from individuals, other districts, or any other
- 13 source except receipts derived from adult education, receipts derived
- 14 from summer school tuition, receipts derived from early childhood
- 15 education tuition, tuition receipts from converted contracts beginning
- 16 with the calculation of state aid to be distributed in school fiscal year
- 17 2011-12, and receipts from educational entities as defined in section
- 18 79-1201.01 for providing distance education courses through the
- 19 Educational Service Unit Coordinating Council to such educational
- 20 entities;
- 21 (4) Transportation receipts;
- 22 (5) Interest on investments;
- 23 (6) Other miscellaneous noncategorical local receipts, not including
- 24 receipts from private foundations, individuals, associations, or
- 25 charitable organizations;
- 26 (7) Special education receipts;
- 27 (8) Special education receipts and non-special education receipts
- 28 from the state for wards of the court and wards of the state;
- 29 (9) All receipts from the temporary school fund. Receipts from the
- 30 temporary school fund shall only include (a) receipts pursuant to section
- 31 79-1035 and (b) the receipt of funds pursuant to section 79-1036 for

- 1 property leased for a public purpose as set forth in subdivision (1)(a)
- 2 of section 77-202;
- 3 (10) Motor vehicle tax receipts received;
- 4 (11) Pro rata motor vehicle license fee receipts;
- 5 (12) Other miscellaneous state receipts excluding revenue from the
- 6 textbook loan program authorized by section 79-734;
- 7 (13) Impact aid entitlements for the school fiscal year which have
- 8 actually been received by the district to the extent allowed by federal
- 9 law;
- 10 (14) All other noncategorical federal receipts;
- 11 (15) All receipts pursuant to the enrollment option program under
- 12 sections 79-232 to 79-246;
- 13 (16) Receipts under the federal Medicare Catastrophic Coverage Act
- 14 of 1988, as such act existed on January 1, 2014, as authorized pursuant
- 15 to sections 43-2510 and 43-2511 for services to school-age children,
- 16 excluding amounts designated as reimbursement for costs associated with
- 17 the implementation and administration of the billing system pursuant to
- 18 section 43-2511;
- 19 (16 17) Receipts for accelerated or differentiated curriculum
- 20 programs pursuant to sections 79-1106 to 79-1108.03; and
- 21 (17 18) Revenue received from the nameplate capacity tax distributed
- 22 pursuant to section 77-6204.
- 23 Sec. 6. Section 79-1119, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 24 amended to read:
- 25 79-1119 For aid distributed in school fiscal years prior to 2015-16,
- 26 excess cost means the difference between the total cost of the special
- 27 education program excluding residential care and the number of students
- 28 in the special education program multiplied by the adjusted average per
- 29 pupil cost of the preceding year for the school district of residence of
- 30 each child. For aid distributed in school fiscal years year 2015-16 and
- 31 2016-17 each school fiscal year thereafter, excess cost means the

- 1 difference between the total cost of the special education program
- 2 excluding residential care minus federal medicaid funds received pursuant
- 3 to section 43-2511 for services to school-age children excluding amounts
- 4 designated as reimbursement for costs associated with the implementation
- 5 and administration of the billing system pursuant to section 43-2511 and
- 6 minus the product of the number of students in the special education
- 7 program multiplied by the adjusted average per pupil cost of the
- 8 preceding year for the school district of residence of each child.
