## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 802**

Committee: Health and Human Services

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to public health and welfare; to state intent;
- 2 to create the Health and Climate Resiliency Task Force; and to
- 3 provide powers and duties.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. The Legislature finds that:
- 2 (1) Climate change presents serious, diverse, and ongoing issues for
- 3 Nebraska, including serious impacts to the health and well-being of
- 4 Nebraskans;
- 5 (2) Many sectors that play a role in human health and well-being
- 6 will be impacted by climate change, including water resources,
- 7 agriculture, health care, energy generation and use, ecosystems, rural
- 8 and urban communities, and insurance;
- 9 (3) Nebraska's life-giving water and soil resources will be subject
- 10 to new stresses and risks due to climate change;
- 11 (4) The impacts of climate change on food production and global food
- 12 security are particularly important for the health and well-being of the
- 13 people of Nebraska because of the importance of agriculture to the
- 14 <u>state's economy and as a source of food, fiber, and fuel for people in</u>
- 15 the state and around the world;
- 16 (5) There are opportunities to improve the health and well-being of
- 17 the people of Nebraska through appropriate responses to climate change,
- 18 including (a) opportunities to provide leadership through adaptation and
- 19 mitigation measures to ensure Nebraska's continued agricultural
- 20 prominence in a changed climate, (b) reduced pollution by reducing use of
- 21 fossil fuels, (c) opportunities for development of new technologies, (d)
- 22 economic opportunities from development of the abundant wind and solar
- 23 resources of the state, and (e) new products that match Nebraska's needs
- 24 <u>and resources;</u>
- 25 (6) The report entitled Understanding and Assessing Climate Change
- 26 <u>Implications for Nebraska, University of Nebraska-Lincoln, 2014, provides</u>
- 27 <u>a fundamental basis for understanding the impacts of climate change for</u>
- 28 Nebraska;
- 29 <u>(7) Appropriate planning is needed to develop strategies to mitigate</u>
- 30 and adapt to the impacts of climate change on the health and well-being
- 31 of Nebraskans;

- 1 (8) The state must invest in research and data gathering, planning,
- 2 <u>education</u>, and <u>coordination</u> of <u>efforts</u> related to <u>mitigation</u> and
- 3 adaptation to the impacts of climate change on human health and well-
- 4 being; and
- 5 (9) An effective plan to meet the challenges of climate change will
- 6 enable the state and its communities to take advantage of opportunities
- 7 from adaptation and mitigation strategies, including attracting new
- 8 businesses and investment to Nebraska, as well as reducing the potential
- 9 negative impacts to human health and well-being caused by climate change.
- 10 Sec. 2. <u>(1) The Health and Climate Resiliency Task Force is</u>
- 11 <u>created. The task force shall consist of the following voting members:</u>
- 12 <u>(a) Two members appointed by the chairperson of the Agriculture</u>
- 13 <u>Committee of the Legislature;</u>
- (b) Two members appointed by the chairperson of the Appropriations
- 15 Committee of the Legislature;
- 16 (c) Two members appointed by the chairperson of the Education
- 17 Committee of the Legislature;
- 18 (d) Two members appointed by the chairperson of the Health and Human
- 19 Services Committee of the Legislature; and
- 20 <u>(e) Two members appointed by the chairperson of the Natural</u>
- 21 Resources Committee of the Legislature.
- 22 (2) The voting members of the task force shall choose a chairperson
- 23 and a vice-chairperson from among the voting members.
- 24 (3) The following shall be nonvoting, ex officio members of the task
- 25 force:
- 26 (a) The Director of Agriculture or his or her designee;
- 27 (b) The Director of Environmental Quality or his or her designee;
- 28 (c) The chief executive officer of the Department of Health and
- 29 <u>Human Services or his or her designee;</u>
- 30 (d) The Director of Insurance or his or her designee;
- 31 (e) The Director of Natural Resources or his or her designee;

1 (f) The director of the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency or his

- 2 or her designee;
- 3 (g) The Director of the State Energy Office or his or her designee;
- 4 (h) The director of the Bureau of Business Research of the
- 5 <u>University of Nebraska-Lincoln or his or her designee;</u>
- 6 (i) The director of the National Drought Mitigation Center of the
- 7 University of Nebraska-Lincoln or his or her designee;
- 8 (j) The State Climatologist of the Nebraska Climate Office of the
- 9 <u>University of Nebraska-Lincoln or his or her designee;</u>
- 10 <u>(k) The director of the High Plains Regional Climate Center of the</u>
- 11 <u>University of Nebraska-Lincoln or his or her designee;</u>
- 12 <u>(1) The director of the College of Public Health of the University</u>
- 13 <u>of Nebraska Medical Center or his or her designee;</u>
- 14 (m) The State Forester of the Nebraska Forest Service of the
- 15 University of Nebraska or his or her designee; and
- 16 <u>(n) The director of the Daugherty Water for Food Institute of the</u>
- 17 University of Nebraska or his or her designee.
- 18 (4) The voting members of the task force shall appoint an advisory
- 19 committee using an application and selection process. The advisory
- 20 <u>committee members shall be appointed to represent (a) academic experts in</u>
- 21 issues related to public health and climate change, (b) advocacy groups
- 22 that work on issues related to climate change, (c) advocacy groups that
- 23 work on public health issues, (d) business organizations, (e) counties,
- 24 (f) municipalities, (g) natural resource districts, (h) public health
- 25 officials, (i) public power districts, (j) state and federal agencies,
- 26 <u>and (k) such other members as deemed appropriate. The advisory committee</u>
- 27 <u>members shall be nonvoting members of the task force.</u>
- 28 (5) The task force shall encourage participation from academic
- 29 experts, advocacy organizations, and members of the public in exploring
- 30 methods to address issues of climate change on human health and well-
- 31 <u>being as well as opportunities to adapt, mitigate, and create resiliency</u>

- 1 related to climate change on human health and well-being.
- 2 Sec. 3. The Health and Climate Resiliency Task Force shall create a
- 3 strategic plan for the State of Nebraska related to the impacts of
- 4 climate change on the health and well-being of Nebraskans that includes:
- 5 <u>(1) Measurable goals and benchmarks, including actions needed to</u>
- 6 meet the goals and benchmarks for addressing the negative impacts of
- 7 climate change on human health and opportunities to improve health and
- 8 <u>well-being and increase resilience, including strategies for adaptation</u>
- 9 and mitigation; and
- 10 (2) Recommendations for new policies and changes to policies and
- 11 programs that support the goals and benchmarks based on the information
- 12 and data collected and generated under section 4 of this act, including
- 13 <u>funding needs and recommendations for legislation.</u>
- 14 Sec. 4. In order to develop the strategic plan required by section
- 15 3 of this act, the Health and Climate Resiliency Task Force shall:
- 16 (1) Gather, share, examine, and analyze data and information related
- 17 to the impacts of climate change on human health and well-being,
- 18 including assessments of vulnerability, risks, economic impacts, and
- 19 adaptation and mitigation actions. Issues to be examined shall include
- 20 the implications of climate change on the following:
- 21 <u>(a) Extreme events such as blizzards, drough</u>ts, fires, floods,
- 22 heatwaves, and tornadoes;
- 23 <u>(b) Food and food security, including changes to agricultural</u>
- 24 <u>production;</u>
- 25 (c) Vector borne illnesses;
- 26 <u>(d) Air pollution;</u>
- 27 (e) Water quantity and quality and resulting impacts to agriculture,
- 28 domestic use, and power production;
- 29 <u>(f) Energy production and use;</u>
- 30 (g) Ecosystems, including forests, wildlife, and habitat;
- 31 (h) Rural and urban communities;

- 1 (i) Mental health, including social change and migration;
- 2 (j) Insurance;
- 3 (k) National and local security; and
- 4 (1) The extent that the public is being provided accurate and
- 5 current information about climate change and its impacts on health and
- 6 well-being; and
- 7 (2) Examine opportunities related to climate change, including:
- 8 (a) Strategies for adaptation and mitigation that will improve the
- 9 <u>health and well-being of the people of Nebraska;</u>
- 10 (b) Economic opportunities with a particular emphasis on development
- 11 and adoption of new methods and management strategies in support of the
- 12 <u>agricultural economy of the state, methods of generating power, or</u>
- 13 <u>beneficial use of land and water that can be used to adapt to and</u>
- 14 mitigate the impacts of climate change on human health and well-being
- 15 that will provide jobs and economic return to Nebraskans; and
- (c) Opportunities for public education and outreach.
- 17 Sec. 5. To accomplish its duties under sections 2 to 6 of this act,
- 18 the Health and Climate Resiliency Task Force may:
- 19 (1) Hold one or more public hearings;
- 20 (2) Request and receive information from any state or local
- 21 governmental entity or institution, including academic reports;
- 22 (3) Authorize studies and reports related to health and climate
- 23 <u>change consequences or benefits, including studies of the economic</u>
- 24 <u>impacts; a</u>nd
- 25 (4) Appoint special committees to advise and assist the task force.
- 26 The chairperson of the task force shall appoint members for any special
- 27 <u>committee of the task force from among the members of the task force or</u>
- 28 individuals from the public or private sector. A special committee shall
- 29 report to the task force on the progress of the special committee as
- 30 <u>assigned.</u>
- 31 Sec. 6. On or before December 15, 2016, the Health and Climate

- 1 Resiliency Task Force shall submit the strategic plan required by section
- 2 <u>3 of this act to the Governor and electronically to the Executive Board</u>
- 3 <u>of the Legislative Council.</u>
