## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 866**

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to juveniles; to adopt the Transition to Adult
- 2 Living Success Program Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

## 1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 6 of this act shall be known and may be 2 cited as the Transition to Adult Living Success Program Act. 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Transition to Adult Living Success <u>Program Act:</u> 4 5 (1) Department means the Department of Health and Human Services; (2) Eligible participant means an individual who was adjudicated to 6 7 be a juvenile described in subdivision (1), (2), or (3)(b) of section 43-247 and upon attaining nineteen years of age was in an out-of-home 8 9 placement and had been in an out-of-home placement for at least ninety of 10 the one hundred eighty days preceding his or her nineteenth birthday; and (3) Program means the Transition to Adult Living Success Program 11 12 established pursuant to section 3 of this act. 13 The department shall establish the Transition to Adult Sec. 3. Living Success Program. The program shall provide independent living 14 15 services to eligible participants, which services shall include, but are not limited to, assessment, securing housing, face-to-face life skills 16 17 training, and assistance in furthering education or employment. The 18 program shall provide case management for the achievement of the goals in 19 a transition plan developed with the eligible participant as part of the program until he or she reaches twenty-one years of age. 20

21 Eligible participants may request funds for critical needs Sec. 4. 22 relating to food, shelter, health care, clothing, or other needs as approved by the caseworker, not to exceed one thousand dollars per year 23 24 per eligible participant. Individuals who are eligible to participate in 25 both the Transition to Adult Living Success Program and the bridge to independence program pursuant to section 43-4504 may choose to 26 27 participate in either the Transition to Adult Living Success Program and the bridge to independence program but may not participate in both 28 29 programs.

30 Sec. 5. <u>The department shall collect data regarding the number of</u> 31 <u>participants in the Transition to Adult Living Success Program, the</u>
