- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to juries; to amend section 29-2022, Reissue
- 2 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions relating to jury
- 3 sequestration; and to repeal the original section.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 29-2022, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 amended to read:
- 3 29-2022 <u>The court may order a jury sequestered during trial or</u>
- 4 after a case is finally submitted to the jury on the court's own motion
- 5 or on motion by a party if good cause is shown. When a case is finally
- 6 submitted to the jury, they must be kept together in some convenient
- 7 place, under the charge of an officer, until they agree upon a verdict or
- 8 are discharged by the court. The officer having them in charge shall not
- 9 suffer any communication to be made to them, or make any himself, except
- 10 to ask them whether they have agreed upon a verdict, unless by order of
- 11 the court; nor shall he communicate to anyone, before the verdict is
- 12 delivered, any matter in relation to the state of their deliberations. If
- 13 the jury <u>separates</u> are permitted to separate during the trial, the jurors
- 14 they shall be admonished by the court that it is their duty not to
- 15 converse with <del>or suffer themselves to be addressed by</del> any other person on
- 16 the subject of the trial, nor to listen to any conversation on the
- 17 subject, nor read, listen to, or view any reports of the case in the
- 18 media,  $\div$  and that it is their duty not to form or express an opinion
- 19 thereon until the cause is finally submitted to them.
