Introducer's Statement of Intent

The following constitutes the reasons for this bill and the purposes which are sought to be accomplished thereby:

Legislative Bill 578 amends 11 sections of Election Law. The most significant changes are:

Section 3: Allows poll workers to choose not to be paid or allocate their pay to an organization contracted with the Election Commissioner/County Clerk to recruit poll works for an election.

Section 5: Allows Elections officials and members of Law Enforcement to make copies of a voter's registration form for list maintenance and law enforcement purposes.

Section 8: Allows for the removal of certain information on an Early Ballot Application.

Section 10: Provides clarification on what election items are not subject to inspection until an Election Contest has been filed.

Section 11: Raises the minimum rate that a political subdivision can be charge for an election from 50 to 100 dollars.
