

AMENDMENTS TO LB330

Introduced by Appropriations.

1 1. Strike the original sections and insert the following new
2 sections:

3 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.

4 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill passed by
5 the One Hundred Fifth Legislature, First or Second Session, which
6 appropriates funds, FY2017-18 means the period July 1, 2017, through June
7 30, 2018, FY2018-19 means the period July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019,
8 FY2019-20 means the period July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2020, and
9 FY2020-21 means the period July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021.

10 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.

11 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2017-18 and FY2018-19, the sums
12 set forth in this act to each agency for each program from the respective
13 funds for capital construction projects, land acquisition, lease-purchase
14 arrangements, and major equipment acquisition, except as otherwise
15 appropriated.

16 Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2017-18 to FY2018-19.

17 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act, there are
18 hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation balances existing on
19 June 30, 2018, for FY2018-19 to the respective agencies, programs, and
20 funds listed in this act, except as otherwise provided in this act.

21 Sec. 4. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.

22 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting System Manual,
23 and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of the Legislature are
24 hereby adopted by the Legislature as the definitions for this act.

25 Sec. 5. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.

26 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw warrants upon the
27 proper fund in the state treasury for an amount not to exceed the

1 appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation of proper
2 documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay the warrants out of the
3 appropriate funds.

4 Sec. 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that the appropriations
5 for capital facilities follow an orderly and reasonable process based
6 upon defined and documented need and an analysis of the utilization of
7 existing facilities.

8 The biennial appropriations contained in this act covering FY2017-18
9 and FY2018-19, which have been designated for planning, require from the
10 agency a complete program statement prepared in accordance with the
11 Procedural Manual for Capital Construction as approved by the state
12 building division of the Department of Administrative Services. Projects
13 directly related to program continuation such as fire and life safety,
14 maintenance, utility improvements, handicapped access, and master
15 planning require a statement of needs prepared in accordance with the
16 manual. An appropriation for drawings and construction may be recommended
17 only after submission of an acceptable program statement or statement of
18 needs on or before September 15 to the state building division, the
19 budget division of the Department of Administrative Services, and the
20 Legislative Fiscal Analyst.

21 Program statements that have been submitted prior to FY2017-18 shall
22 be updated if necessary and resubmitted during the period July 1, 2017,
23 to September 1, 2017. Program statements that have been submitted prior
24 to FY2018-19 shall be updated if necessary and resubmitted during the
25 period July 1, 2018, to September 1, 2018, by agency priority. Such
26 priority shall be subject to final modification by the governing
27 authority of each agency on or before September 15, 2018.

28 Sec. 7. It is the intent of the Legislature that agencies should
29 construct or renovate facilities in such a manner as to provide the
30 greatest cost-effective energy savings possible. Design criteria
31 emphasizing efficiency, functionality, and energy conservation shall be

1 reflected in program statements, schematic design documents, design
2 development documents, and construction documents. The state building
3 division of the Department of Administrative Services and the State
4 Energy Office shall provide technical assistance to the state agencies,
5 upon request, to assist them in providing for energy-efficient new or
6 renovated facilities.

17 males in state custody.

19 program an estimated \$2,897,000 to demolish buildings at the Hastings
20 Regional Center determined by the Vacant Building and Excess Land
21 Committee to be vacant as defined in section 72-811.

2 Rangeland Center at Chadron State College. The amount of Rangeland Center
3 project costs to be met by appropriations pursuant to this section is
4 estimated at \$3,696,470. The board is also authorized to renovate the
5 U.S. Conn Library at Wayne State College. The amount of U.S. Conn Library
6 project costs to be met by appropriations pursuant to this section is

10 Beginning with the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2013, and
11 continuing through the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021, the Legislature
12 shall appropriate each fiscal year from the General Fund an amount not
13 less than \$2,216,000 to be used by the Board of Trustees of the Nebraska
14 State Colleges to pay the costs of constructing a Rangeland Center at
15 Chadron State College and renovating the U.S. Conn Library at Wayne State
16 College. The board may enter into long-term financing contracts with any
17 person, firm, or corporation for the Rangeland Center and U.S. Conn
18 Library projects. The payments of the costs of the projects may occur
19 over a contract period not to extend beyond June 30, 2021. The board
20 shall not pledge the credit of the State of Nebraska for the payment of
21 any sum owing on account of such contract, except that there may be
22 pledged for the payment of any such contract any appropriations made by
23 the Legislature for such purpose. No contract shall be entered into
24 pursuant to this section without prior approval by resolution by the
25 board. The board may also convey, lease, or lease back all or any part of
26 the Rangeland Center and U.S. Conn Library projects and the land on which
27 such projects are situated to such person, firm, or corporation as the
28 board may contract with pursuant to this section to facilitate the long-
29 term payment of the costs of the Rangeland Center and U.S. Conn Library
30 projects. Any such conveyance or lease shall provide that when the costs
31 of the Rangeland Center and U.S. Conn Library projects have been paid,

1 together with interest and other costs thereon, the Rangeland Center and
2 U.S. Conn Library projects and the land on which such projects are
3 located shall become the property of the board. The board may schedule
4 contractual payments on a monthly, quarterly, or semiannual basis
5 consistent with the state fiscal year. On or before August 31, 2021, any
6 funds appropriated from the General Fund for the projects held in the
7 state treasury and held by any trustee which are not necessary to meet
8 the terms of any long-term financing agreements entered into pursuant to
9 this section shall be transferred to the General Fund.

4 entities and from nonfederal governmental agencies.

5 At the discretion of the budget administrator of the budget division
6 of the Department of Administrative Services and the Accounting
7 Administrator of the Department of Administrative Services, expenditures
8 of funds from any gift, bequest, or devise may be expended through any
9 existing or administratively created cash fund account, revolving fund
10 account, or trust fund account, in which case the actual amount of the
11 gift, bequest, or devise is hereby appropriated to the expending agency,
12 for the purpose or purposes designated by the donor, in addition to the
13 amounts appropriated in this act. If no such cash fund account, revolving
14 fund account, or trust fund account exists, the Accounting Administrator
15 may create such fund account as is necessary to properly and separately
16 account for the gift, bequest, or devise, in which case the actual amount
