RE: Annual Report for the Year of 2016 – Number of licenses suspended under the License Suspension Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. §\$43-3301 to 43-3326

Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-3326, the Department is required by law to issue a report to the Legislature on or before January 31<sup>st</sup> of each year, which discloses the number of licenses that were suspended and the number which were erroneously suspended and restored as a result of the License Suspension Act. If a person is delinquent three months or more in paying child support the Department may initiate a process to suspend their drivers license, if the payment is not received then the Department works to suspend recreational licenses then professional licenses until payment is received. The numbers below represent the licenses suspended during this process in 2016.
