Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 1085 would amend the Community Development Law to extend the maximum length of time for the repayment of indebtedness related to tax-increment financing (TIF) in certain cases. Under the bill, if more than one-half of the property in the project area is designated as extremely blighted, the maximum repayment period would be extended from 15 years to 20 years.

Currently, Article VIII, Section 12 of the Nebraska State Constitution sets the maximum TIF repayment period at 15 years. A proposed constitutional amendment to extend the repayment period from 15 years to 20 years if more than one-half of the property in the project area is designated as extremely blighted, LR 16CA, is currently pending before the Legislature. LB 1085 would implement the provisions of LR 16CA if the proposed constitutional amendment is approved by the voters.
