Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 22, introduced by the Speaker at the request of the Governor, is part of the Governor's expedited FY 2016-17 budget adjustment recommendations. The bill makes adjustments to appropriations and re-appropriations for state operations, aid and construction programs in the current fiscal year ending June 30, 2017, provides for transfers, and modifies intent language and earmarks accompanying appropriations approved by the 104th Legislature.

This legislative bill contains the emergency clause.
