## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 267 will amend Section 71-468 of the Health Care Facility Licensure Act for acute hospitals and intermediate care facilities to act in accordance with recommendations of the advisory committee on immunization practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the United States Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and Human Services as the recommendations existed on January 1, 2017.

LB 267 will also amend Section 71-468 of the Health Care Facility Licensure Act to mandate all nursing facilities and skilled nursing facilities to offer annual onsite vaccinations for influenza and pneumococcal disease to all employees, residents and inpatients. Annual onsite vaccinations must begin no later than October 1 and ends on April 1. The facilities will act in accordance with recommendations of the advisory committee on immunization practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the United States Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and Human Services as the recommendations existed on January 1, 2017.

## SECTION BY SECTION:

Section 1: Amend Section 71-468 of the Health Care Facility Licensure Act for acute hospitals and intermediate care facilities to act in accordance with recommendations of the advisory committee on immunization practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the United States Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and Human Services as the recommendations existed on January 1, 2017 for onsite vaccinations for influenza and

pneumococcal disease for all residents and all inpatients prior to discharge.

Mandate all nursing facilities and skilled nursing facilities to offer annual onsite vaccinations for influenza and pneumococcal disease to all employees, residents and inpatients. Annual onsite vaccinations must begin no later than October 1 and ends on April 1. The facilities will act in accordance with recommendations of the advisory committee on immunization practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the United States Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and Human Services as the recommendations existed on January 1, 2017.

Section 2: Repeal Section 71-468.
