Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 929 enumerates certain rights of members of the Nebraska National Guard. The rights included in the bill are as follows:

- To seek employment with state, county, and local government
- To donate to political parties
- To participate with a state, county, or local government in a law enforcement function as prescribed by that government
- To receive address publication protections after a written request for those protections.

Sections 2 conforms existing law to the aforementioned rights.

Explanation of amendments:

AM 2350 clarifies when address protections apply to service members.
