## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill would allow reciprocity certification for military veterans whose military occupational specialty (MOS) involved law enforcement, criminal investigation, or other police work. A veteran with such an MOS would be eligible for a law enforcement certification by the Nebraska Police Standards Advisory Council (NPSAC) without attending basic law enforcement certification training in Nebraska.

The bill would require a veteran seeking such reciprocity certification to submit documentation as determined by the director. The director would be granted some discretion in reviewing applications to determine whether the applicant's training and education meet the standards for reciprocity certification. Applicants eligible for reciprocity certification would be required to complete a reciprocity certification program. NPSAC would be granted the discretionary authority to promulgate related rules and regulations.
