Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

This bill makes technical changes to the credentialing review process. Requests for regulation of currently unregulated professions and requests for scope of practice changes would be handled by technical committees composed of membership from the Board of Health instead of committees appointed by the Board of Health. Technical committee membership changes from seven to six members.

Under current law, technical committees are appointed by the Board of Health with one member from the Board also serving on each technical committee. Technical committee members are reimbursed for travel expenses, but do not receive a per diem. Board of Health members receive a per diem and travel expenses. It is assumed in this fiscal note and that of the Department of Health and Human Services that per diems would be paid when board members were participating in technical committees. The additional per diems are estimated to be \$1,440 GF per year. The costs are paid from licensing fees.

The fiscal note by the Department of Health and Human Services assumes additional travel costs. However, current technical committee members are eligible for travel reimbursement, so there should not be additional costs and could have a slight reduction since the number of members is decrease by one per committee.

Technical note: The provision that prohibits board members from receiving per diems appears to be in conflict with the statute governing the State Board of Health. Section 71-2605 states that board members receive a per diem while engaged in the business of the board. It's unclear if the technical committees would be considered the business of the board.

71-2605 authorizes a \$20 per diem for Board of Health members. The Department estimates an increase in per diem costs of \$1,440 annually based on the following:
