Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

This bill would provide an exception to certain crimes for persons witnessing or experiencing drug overdoses and provide protection from civil liability for emergency responders and peace officers administering naloxone.

This bill could reduce the number of persons who are sent to prison because it provides an exception to certain crimes. This could result in per diem savings to the Department of Correctional Services (NDCS) because there would be fewer inmates than under current law. For every inmate, NDCS incurs per diem costs. This is the cost for food, medical care, inmate wages, clothing, cleaning supplies, food service supplies, cell and dorm supplies, other inmate related supplies, laundry, inmate property, miscellaneous contractual services, and inmate transportation. The FY16 per diem cost for an individual inmate was \$9,484 per year.

Fewer people sent to prison could also reduce the prison population. As of July-September 2016, the state inmate prison population was 156.72% of design capacity. In July-September 2015, the state inmate prison population was 156.47% of design capacity. Additionally, the Department of Correctional Services (DCS) contracts with some counties to temporarily house prison inmates. If those inmates are included in the state prison population numbers, then the July-September 2016 inmate prison population would be 162.72% of design capacity.

The Department of Correctional Services (NDCS) states that this bill has the potential to reduce admissions for drug possession in overdose situations. NDCS has no information on how often individuals are currently charged with felony drug possession in overdose cases and as a result the fiscal impact of this bill is indeterminable at this time.

The Attorney General and DAS Risk Management both estimate no fiscal impact from this bill. See the response of DAS Risk Management attached for additional details not included in this fiscal note.
