This bill provides a clearer definition of the diseases for which all infants are screened. The Department of Health and Human Services is authorized to charge a fee of up to \$10 for these screenings; the bill authorizes the fee to be up to \$20. The fee is used to pay the costs for the central data registry; tracking; monitoring; referral; quality assurance; program operation, development, and evaluation and treatment.

If the department increases the fee to the maximum of \$20, an additional \$270,000 would be generated.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 91 would clarify language on newborn disease screening in existing statute by removing the term "metabolic" and replacing it with "inherited or congenital infant or childhood-onset" where appropriate and by defining pharmaceutically manufactured foods.

Additionally, LB 91 would permit the Department of Health and Human Services to increase the administration fee collected by the contracting laboratory from \$10 up to \$20. The fee may be used to pay the costs of the central data registry, tracking, monitoring, referral, quality assurance, program operation, program development, program evaluation, and treatment services authorized under sections 71-519 to 71-523. With approximately 27,000 annual births in Nebraska, a fee increase to \$20 would generate an additional \$270,000 in revenue.
