Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 998 creates the Collaborative School Behavioral and Mental Health Program. The goal of the program is to provide a social worker in each educational service unit (ESU) to train school personnel and to work with parents, schools, behavioral and mental health care providers and other community resources to provide timely, effective and family-centered services.

The bill establishes a Collaborative School Behavioral and Mental Health Fund which is to be administered by the ESU Coordinating Council. The fund is to consist of money transferred by the Legislature, donations, bequests, or other contributions from public or private entities or any federal funds. The State Investment Officer is responsible for investing the proceeds of the fund.

When the fund reaches a balance of at least \$3.6 million, the ESU Coordinating Council is to begin implementing the program by employing a coordinator for the program and a social worker for each ESU. After three years of implementation, each ESU is to determine if it will continue in the program. If so, the cost is shared equally between the ESU, school districts within the ESU, the General Fund and private donations. If the cost of the program is more than the funds available, then the program ceases in the ESU.

<u>General Fund Fiscal Impact</u>: LB 998 has no definite initial fiscal impact for the state in terms of expenditures because it does not require a specific appropriation of general funds to the Collaborative School Behavioral and Mental Health Fund. When the fund reaches \$3.6 million and the program has been implemented for three years, then the bill will have a fiscal impact for the General Fund in the ESU's which opt to continue the program.

<u>Cash Fund Fiscal Impact</u>: It is assumed that any revenue accruing to the Collaborative School Behavioral and Mental Health Fund will be appropriated to the State Department of Education which will allocate the proceeds of the fund to the ESU Coordinating Council at such time when the fund reaches \$3.6 million.

ESU/Schools Fiscal Impact: There is no fiscal impact in terms of increased expenditures for the ESU's until the fund reaches \$3.6 million at which time the implementation of the program will begin. The ESU Coordinating Council will use the fund to employ a coordinator for the program and a social worker for each ESU will be hired. After the program is implemented for three years, the bill will have a fiscal impact for an ESU, and school districts within an ESU, which opts to continue the program.
