- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to water; to provide for voluntary payments in
- lieu of taxes relating to water augmentation projects as prescribed;
- 3 to provide for notices, hearings, annual reports, and submission of
- 4 leases as prescribed; and to declare an emergency.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) Any joint entity created pursuant to the Interlocal
- 2 Cooperation Act or natural resources district that acquires title to
- 3 private lands for the purpose of developing and operating a water
- 4 augmentation project for streamflow enhancement, as authorized by section
- 5 46-715, may agree to make voluntary payments in lieu of taxes to the
- 6 county treasurer of the county in which the land is located. A payment in
- 7 lieu of tax may be made for any year in which the joint entity or natural
- 8 resources district owns the land, including any year prior to the
- 9 effective date of this act. The amount of the payment in lieu of tax for
- 10 any year shall not be more than the real property taxes that would have
- 11 been paid on the land if the land were subject to taxation. The county
- 12 treasurer shall allocate the payment in lieu of tax to the taxing units
- in the county in the same proportion that property taxes would have been
- 14 allocated to such taxing units if the land were subject to taxation.
- 15 (2) Any joint entity created pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation
- 16 Act or natural resources district that has secured a contract or
- 17 memorandum of agreement to acquire title to private land for the purpose
- 18 of developing and operating a water augmentation project for streamflow
- 19 <u>enhancement</u>, as authorized by section 46-715, shall:
- 20 <u>(a) Provide public notice of the joint entity's or district's</u>
- 21 intention to proceed with the water augmentation project. The notice
- 22 shall include the project's intended purpose, an estimate of the amount
- 23 of water that will be pumped for the purpose of augmentation, and the
- 24 timeframe in which the water will be used;
- 25 (b) Hold a public hearing and accept public comment on the project;
- 26 and
- 27 (c) Seek the input of officials from the county in which the project
- 28 <u>will be located and adjoining landowners on ways to minimize the effects</u>
- 29 of the project on the county.
- 30 (3)(a) Any joint entity created pursuant to the Interlocal
- 31 Cooperation Act or natural resources district that is operating a water

1 augmentation project for streamflow enhancement shall publish an annual

- 2 <u>report that includes the following information regarding the project:</u>
- 3 (i) Details on the operation of the project;
- 4 (ii) The amount of water pumped;
- 5 (iii) The amount of land leased and for what purposes;
- 6 (iv) The amount of revenue gained from land leases;
- 7 (v) The amount of payments made in lieu of taxes;
- 8 <u>(vi) Financial details of the project, including the amount of debt,</u>
- 9 the amount of outstanding bonds and loans, and the project budget;
- 10 (vii) Whether the project is achieving its intended purpose;
- 11 (viii) The effect of the project on ground water supplies; and
- 12 (ix) Projections for use of the project in the future and the effect
- 13 of the use on ground water supplies.
- 14 (b) The joint entity or natural resources district shall provide
- 15 public notice and hold a public hearing to allow an opportunity for
- 16 <u>public comment on the report required under subdivision (3)(a) of this</u>
- 17 section.
- 18 <u>(4) Any joint entity created pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation</u>
- 19 Act or natural resources district that has acquired title to private
- 20 lands for the purpose of developing and operating a water augmentation
- 21 project for streamflow enhancement, as authorized by section 46-715,
- 22 shall submit all leases relating to such lands to the appropriate county
- 23 assessor within thirty days after the effective date of the lease.
- 24 Sec. 2. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 25 passed and approved according to law.
