- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to state government; to state findings; to
- 2 provide for replacement of statues in the National Statuary Hall of
- 3 the United States Capitol as prescribed; to create committees and
- 4 cash funds; to provide duties; and to declare an emergency.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. The Legislature finds and declares:
- 2 (1) In 1864, the United States Congress established the National
- 3 Statuary Hall Collection in the Old Hall of the House of Representatives
- 4 in the United States Capitol and authorized each state to contribute to
- 5 the hall collection two statues that represent important historical
- 6 figures of each state;
- 7 (2) Nebraska currently has on display in the National Statuary Hall
- 8 <u>Collection statues of William Jennings Bryan and Julius Sterling Morton</u>
- 9 given by the State of Nebraska in 1937;
- 10 (3) In 2000, the United States Congress enacted legislation
- 11 <u>authorizing states to request that the Joint Committee on the Library of</u>
- 12 <u>Congress approve the replacement of statues the state had provided for</u>
- 13 <u>display in the hall collection;</u>
- 14 (4)(a) Willa Cather is a significant historical and literary figure
- 15 from Red Cloud, Nebraska;
- 16 (b) Willa Cather immortalized Nebraska in such works as My Antonia
- 17 and O Pioneers!;
- 18 (c) Willa Cather won the 1923 Pulitzer Prize for her novel One of
- 19 Ours; and
- 20 <u>(d) Willa Cather is worthy of recognition in the National Statuary</u>
- 21 Hall; and
- 22 (5)(a) Ponca Chief Standing Bear is a significant historical and
- 23 <u>civil rights figure from Nebraska's Niobrara River Valley region;</u>
- 24 (b) Chief Standing Bear's epic return to his Nebraska homeland to
- 25 bury his son culminated in the historic court case, United States ex rel.
- 26 Crook v. Standing Bear, which took place in Omaha, Nebraska, in May 1879;
- 27 <u>(c) The court case set the historic precedent that Chief Standing</u>
- 28 Bear, as a Native American individual, was found to be a person under the
- 29 <u>law; and</u>
- 30 (d) Chief Standing Bear is worthy of recognition in the National
- 31 Statuary Hall.

- 1 Sec. 2. The Secretary of State shall submit to the United States
- 2 Architect of the Capitol for his or her review for completeness a written
- 3 <u>request to approve the replacement of the statue of Julius Sterling</u>
- 4 Morton currently on display in the National Statuary Hall Collection in
- 5 <u>the United States Capitol with a statue of Willa Cather. The written</u>
- 6 request shall request authorization to provide a new statue, a
- 7 description of the location in Nebraska where the replaced statue will be
- 8 <u>displayed after it is transferred, and a copy of the Nebraska statute</u>
- 9 authorizing such replacement. After such review, it is the intent of the
- 10 <u>Legislature that the architect forward the request to the Joint Committee</u>
- on the Library of Congress for its approval or denial. If the request is
- 12 approved by the committee, the architect and the Willa Cather National
- 13 <u>Statuary Hall Selection Committee created pursuant to section 3 of this</u>
- 14 <u>act, acting on behalf of the State of Nebraska, shall enter into an</u>
- 15 agreement as provided in 2 U.S.C. 2132(b).
- 16 Sec. 3. <u>(1) The Willa Cather National Statuary Hall Selection</u>
- 17 Committee is created. The committee shall consist of members of the
- 18 Nebraska Hall of Fame Commission created pursuant to section 72-724.
- 19 <u>(2) Upon approval by the Joint Committee on the Library of Congress</u>
- 20 and pursuant to the agreement described in section 2 of this act, the
- 21 Willa Cather National Statuary Hall Selection Committee shall:
- 22 (a) Select a sculptor to create a statue of Willa Cather to be
- 23 placed in the National Statuary Hall and review and approve the plans for
- 24 the statue; and
- 25 (b) Identify a method to obtain necessary funding to pay for all of
- 26 the following. All funds shall be privately donated and separately
- 27 managed. No state funds shall be expended for such purposes:
- 28 (i) The sculptor for designing and carving or casting the statue;
- 29 (ii) The design and fabrication of the pedestal;
- 30 (iii) The transportation of the statue and pedestal to the United
- 31 States Capitol;

- 1 (iv) The removal and transportation of the replaced statue;
- 2 (v) The temporary placement of the new statue in the Rotunda of the
- 3 <u>United States Capitol for the unveiling ceremony;</u>
- 4 (vi) The unveiling ceremony; and
- 5 (vii) Any other expenses that the committee determines are necessary
- 6 to incur.
- 7 (3) The committee has the authority to receive and disburse gifts.
- 8 <u>(4) The committee shall execute the requirements of this section no</u>
- 9 <u>later than June 30, 2023.</u>
- 10 Sec. 4. <u>The Willa Cather National Statuary Hall Cash Fund is</u>
- 11 created. The fund shall be administered by the Nebraska State Historical
- 12 Society. The fund shall consist of privately donated funds pursuant to
- 13 <u>subdivision (2)(b) of section 3 of this act. Any money in the fund</u>
- 14 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment
- 15 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
- 16 State Funds Investment Act.
- 17 Sec. 5. The Secretary of State shall submit to the United States
- 18 Architect of the Capitol for his or her review for completeness a written
- 19 request to approve the replacement of the statue of William Jennings
- 20 Bryan currently on display in the National Statuary Hall Collection in
- 21 the United States Capitol with a statue of Ponca Chief Standing Bear. The
- 22 written request shall request authorization to provide a new statue, a
- 23 description of the location in Nebraska where the replaced statue will be
- 24 displayed after it is transferred, and a copy of the Nebraska statute
- 25 authorizing such replacement. After such review, it is the intent of the
- 26 Legislature that the architect forward the request to the Joint Committee
- 27 <u>on the Library of Congress for its approval or denial. If the request is</u>
- 28 approved by the committee, the architect and the Chief Standing Bear
- 29 National Statuary Hall Selection Committee created pursuant to section 6
- 30 of this act, acting on behalf of the State of Nebraska, shall enter into
- 31 an agreement as provided in 2 U.S.C. 2132(b).

- 1 Sec. 6. (1) The Chief Standing Bear National Statuary Hall
- 2 Selection Committee is created. The committee shall consist of (a) a
- 3 representative of the Commission on Indian Affairs, selected by the
- 4 chairperson of the commission, (b) a member of the State-Tribal Relations
- 5 <u>Committee of the Legislature, selected by the chairperson of the</u>
- 6 committee, (c) the chairperson of the Lincoln Partners for Public Art
- 7 <u>Development or its successor, and (d) the Historic Preservation Planner</u>
- 8 of the City of Lincoln.
- 9 (2) Upon approval by the Joint Committee on the Library of Congress
- 10 and pursuant to the agreement described in section 5 of this act, the
- 11 <u>Chief Standing Bear National Statuary Hall Selection Committee may:</u>
- 12 <u>(a) Select a sculptor to create a statue of Chief Standing Bear to</u>
- 13 <u>be placed in the National Statuary Hall and review and approve the plans</u>
- 14 for the statue; and
- 15 (b) Identify a method to obtain necessary funding to pay for all of
- 16 the following. All funds shall be privately donated and separately
- 17 managed. No state funds shall be expended for such purposes:
- (i) The sculptor for designing and carving or casting the statue;
- 19 (ii) The design and fabrication of the pedestal;
- 20 (iii) The transportation of the statue and pedestal to the United
- 21 States Capitol;
- (iv) The removal and transportation of the replaced statue;
- 23 (v) The temporary placement of the new statue in the Rotunda of the

- 31 Sec. 7. The Chief Standing Bear National Statuary Hall Cash Fund is

- 1 <u>created</u>. The fund shall be administered by the Commission on Indian
- 2 Affairs. The fund shall consist of privately donated funds pursuant to
- 3 subdivision (2)(b) of section 6 of this act. Any money in the fund
- 4 <u>available for investment shall be invested by the state investment</u>
- 5 <u>officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska</u>
- 6 State Funds Investment Act.
- 7 Sec. 8. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 8 passed and approved according to law.
