- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; to amend section 37-327.04,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 60-301, 60-393,
- 3 60-395, 60-396, 60-3,104, and 60-3,130.04, Revised Statutes
- 4 Supplement, 2017; to provide for Wildlife Conservation Plates; to
- 5 harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 37-327.04, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
2 is amended to read:

3 37-327.04 The Game and Parks Commission Educational Fund is created.
4 The fund shall consist of money credited pursuant to section 60-3,227 and
5 section 9 of this act and any other money as determined by the
6 Legislature. The commission shall use the fund to provide youth education
7 programs relating to wildlife conservation practices. Any money in the
8 fund available for investment shall be invested by the state investment
9 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
10 State Funds Investment Act.

11 Sec. 2. Section 60-301, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, is
12 amended to read:

13 60-301 Sections 60-301 to 60-3,235 and sections 8 and 9 of this act
14 shall be known and may be cited as the Motor Vehicle Registration Act.

15 Sec. 3. Section 60-393, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, is
16 amended to read:

17 60-393 Any owner who has two or more motor vehicles or trailers
18 required to be registered under the Motor Vehicle Registration Act may
19 register all such motor vehicles or trailers on a calendar-year basis or
20 on an annual basis for the same registration period beginning in a month
21 chosen by the owner. When electing to establish the same registration
22 period for all such motor vehicles or trailers, the owner shall pay the
23 registration fee, the motor vehicle tax imposed in section 60-3,185, the
24 motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190, and the alternative fuel
25 fee imposed in section 60-3,191 on each motor vehicle for the number of
26 months necessary to extend its current registration period to the
27 registration period under which all such motor vehicles or trailers will
28 be registered. Credit shall be given for registration paid on each motor
29 vehicle or trailer when the motor vehicle or trailer has a later
30 expiration date than that chosen by the owner except as otherwise
31 provided in sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128,

1 60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,233, ~~and~~ 60-3,235, and section 9 of this act.
2 Thereafter all such motor vehicles or trailers shall be registered on an
3 annual basis starting in the month chosen by the owner.

4 Sec. 4. Section 60-395, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, is
5 amended to read:

6 60-395 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this
7 section and sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128,
8 60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,233, ~~and~~ 60-3,235, and section 9 of this act,
9 the registration shall expire and the registered owner or lessee may, by
10 returning the registration certificate, the license plates, and, when
11 appropriate, the validation decals and by either making application on a
12 form prescribed by the department to the county treasurer of the
13 occurrence of an event described in subdivisions (a) through (e) of this
14 subsection or, in the case of a change in situs, displaying to the county
15 treasurer the registration certificate of such other state as evidence of
16 a change in situs, receive a refund of that part of the unused fees and
17 taxes on motor vehicles or trailers based on the number of unexpired
18 months remaining in the registration period from the date of any of the
19 following events:

20 (a) Upon transfer of ownership of any motor vehicle or trailer;

21 (b) In case of loss of possession because of fire, theft,
22 dismantlement, or junking;

23 (c) When a salvage branded certificate of title is issued;

24 (d) Whenever a type or class of motor vehicle or trailer previously
25 registered is subsequently declared by legislative act or court decision
26 to be illegal or ineligible to be operated or towed on the public roads
27 and no longer subject to registration fees, the motor vehicle tax imposed
28 in section 60-3,185, the motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190,
29 and the alternative fuel fee imposed in section 60-3,191;

30 (e) Upon a trade-in or surrender of a motor vehicle under a lease;

31 or

1 (f) In case of a change in the situs of a motor vehicle or trailer
2 to a location outside of this state.

3 (2) If the date of the event falls within the same calendar month in
4 which the motor vehicle or trailer is acquired, no refund shall be
5 allowed for such month.

6 (3) If the transferor or lessee acquires another motor vehicle at
7 the time of the transfer, trade-in, or surrender, the transferor or
8 lessee shall have the credit provided for in this section applied toward
9 payment of the motor vehicle fees and taxes then owing. Otherwise, the
10 transferor or lessee shall file a claim for refund with the county
11 treasurer upon an application form prescribed by the department.

12 (4) The registered owner or lessee shall make a claim for refund or
13 credit of the fees and taxes for the unexpired months in the registration
14 period within sixty days after the date of the event or shall be deemed
15 to have forfeited his or her right to such refund or credit.

16 (5) For purposes of this section, the date of the event shall be:
17 (a) In the case of a transfer or loss, the date of the transfer or loss;
18 (b) in the case of a change in the situs, the date of registration in
19 another state; (c) in the case of a trade-in or surrender under a lease,
20 the date of trade-in or surrender; (d) in the case of a legislative act,
21 the effective date of the act; and (e) in the case of a court decision,
22 the date the decision is rendered.

23 (6) Application for registration or for reassignment of license
24 plates and, when appropriate, validation decals to another motor vehicle
25 or trailer shall be made within thirty days of the date of purchase.

26 (7) If a motor vehicle or trailer was reported stolen under section
27 60-178, a refund under this section shall not be reduced for a lost plate
28 charge and a credit under this section may be reduced for a lost plate
29 charge but the applicant shall not be required to pay the plate fee for
30 new plates.

31 (8) The county treasurer shall refund the motor vehicle fee and

1 registration fee from the fees which have not been transferred to the
2 State Treasurer. The county treasurer shall make payment to the claimant
3 from the undistributed motor vehicle taxes of the taxing unit where the
4 tax money was originally distributed. No refund of less than two dollars
5 shall be paid.

6 Sec. 5. Section 60-396, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, is
7 amended to read:

8 60-396 Whenever the registered owner files an application with the
9 county treasurer showing that a motor vehicle or trailer is disabled and
10 has been removed from service, the registered owner may, by returning the
11 registration certificate, the license plates, and, when appropriate, the
12 validation decals or, in the case of the unavailability of such
13 registration certificate or certificates, license plates, or validation
14 decals, then by making an affidavit to the county treasurer of such
15 disablement and removal from service, receive a credit for a portion of
16 the registration fee from the fee deposited with the State Treasurer at
17 the time of registration based upon the number of unexpired months
18 remaining in the registration year except as otherwise provided in
19 sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128, 60-3,224,
20 60-3,227, 60-3,233, ~~and 60-3,235,~~ and section 9 of this act. The owner
21 shall also receive a credit for the unused portion of the motor vehicle
22 tax and fee based upon the number of unexpired months remaining in the
23 registration year. When the owner registers a replacement motor vehicle
24 or trailer at the time of filing such affidavit, the credit may be
25 immediately applied against the registration fee and the motor vehicle
26 tax and fee for the replacement motor vehicle or trailer. When no such
27 replacement motor vehicle or trailer is so registered, the county
28 treasurer shall forward the application and affidavit, if any, to the
29 State Treasurer who shall determine the amount, if any, of the allowable
30 credit for the registration fee and issue a credit certificate to the
31 owner. For the motor vehicle tax and fee, the county treasurer shall

1 determine the amount, if any, of the allowable credit and issue a credit
2 certificate to the owner. When such motor vehicle or trailer is removed
3 from service within the same month in which it was registered, no credits
4 shall be allowed for such month. The credits may be applied against taxes
5 and fees for new or replacement motor vehicles or trailers incurred
6 within one year after cancellation of registration of the motor vehicle
7 or trailer for which the credits were allowed. When any such motor
8 vehicle or trailer is reregistered within the same registration year in
9 which its registration has been canceled, the taxes and fees shall be
10 that portion of the registration fee and the motor vehicle tax and fee
11 for the remainder of the registration year.

18 Sec. 7. Section 60-3,130.04, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, is
19 amended to read:

20 60-3,130.04 (1) An owner of a historical vehicle eligible for
21 registration under section 60-3,130 may use a license plate or plates
22 designed by this state in the year corresponding to the model year when
23 the vehicle was manufactured in lieu of the plates designed pursuant to
24 section 60-3,130.03 subject to the approval of the department. The
25 department shall inspect the plate or plates and may approve the plate or
26 plates if it is determined that the model-year license plate or plates
27 are legible and serviceable and that the license plate numbers do not
28 conflict with or duplicate other numbers assigned and in use. An
29 original-issued license plate or plates that have been restored to
30 original condition may be used when approved by the department.

31 (2) The department may consult with a recognized car club in

1 determining whether the year of the license plate or plates to be used
2 corresponds to the model year when the vehicle was manufactured.

3 (3) If only one license plate is used on the vehicle, the license
4 plate shall be placed on the rear of the vehicle. The owner of a
5 historical vehicle may use only one plate on the vehicle even for years
6 in which two license plates were issued for vehicles in general.

7 (4) License plates used pursuant to this section corresponding to
8 the year of manufacture of the vehicle shall not be personalized message
9 license plates, Pearl Harbor license plates, prisoner-of-war license
10 plates, disabled veteran license plates, Purple Heart license plates,
11 amateur radio station license plates, Nebraska Cornhusker Spirit Plates,
12 handicapped or disabled person license plates, specialty license plates,
13 special interest motor vehicle license plates, Military Honor Plates,
14 Nebraska 150 Sesquicentennial Plates, Breast Cancer Awareness Plates,
15 Mountain Lion Conservation Plates, Choose Life License Plates, ~~or~~ Native
16 American Cultural Awareness and History Plates, or Wildlife Conservation
17 Plates.

18 Sec. 8. (1) The department shall design license plates to be known
19 as Wildlife Conservation Plates. The department shall create no more than
20 three designs reflecting support for the conservation of Nebraska
21 wildlife, including sandhill cranes, bighorn sheep, and rainbow trout.
22 Each design shall be selected on the basis of limiting the manufacturing
23 cost of each plate to an amount less than or equal to the amount charged
24 for license plates pursuant to section 60-3,102. The department shall
25 make applications available for this type of plate by January 1, 2019.
26 The department may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry
27 out this section and section 9 of this act.

28 (2) One type of Wildlife Conservation Plates shall be alphanumeric
29 plates. The department shall:

30 (a) Assign a designation up to five characters; and

31 (b) Not use a county designation.

1 (3) One type of Wildlife Conservation Plates shall be personalized
2 message plates. Such plates shall be issued subject to the same
3 conditions specified for personalized message license plates in section
4 60-3,118, except that a maximum of five characters may be used.

5 Sec. 9. (1) Beginning January 1, 2019, a person may apply to the
6 department for Wildlife Conservation Plates in lieu of regular license
7 plates on an application prescribed and provided by the department for
8 any motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer, except for a motor vehicle,
9 trailer, or semitrailer registered under section 60-3,198. An applicant
10 receiving a Wildlife Conservation Plate for a farm truck with a gross
11 weight of over sixteen tons shall affix the appropriate tonnage decal to
12 the plate. The department shall make forms available for such
13 applications through the county treasurers. The license plates shall be
14 issued upon payment of the license fee described in subsection (2) of
15 this section.

16 (2)(a) In addition to all other fees required for registration under
17 the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, each application for initial issuance
18 of alphanumeric Wildlife Conservation Plates shall be accompanied by a
19 fee of five dollars. An application for renewal of such plates shall be
20 accompanied by a fee of five dollars. County treasurers collecting fees
21 pursuant to this subdivision shall remit them to the State Treasurer. The
22 State Treasurer shall credit five dollars of the fee to the Game and
23 Parks Commission Educational Fund.

24 (b) In addition to all other fees required for registration under
25 the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, each application for initial issuance
26 or renewal of personalized message Wildlife Conservation Plates shall be
27 accompanied by a fee of forty dollars. County treasurers collecting fees
28 pursuant to this subdivision shall remit them to the State Treasurer. The
29 State Treasurer shall credit twenty-five percent of the fee for initial
30 issuance and renewal of such plates to the Department of Motor Vehicles
31 Cash Fund and seventy-five percent of the fee to the Game and Parks

1 Commission Educational Fund.

2 (3) When the department receives an application for Wildlife
3 Conservation Plates, the department may deliver the plates and
4 registration certificate to the applicant by United States mail or to the
5 county treasurer of the county in which the motor vehicle, trailer, or
6 semitrailer is registered and the delivery of the plates and registration
7 certificate shall be made through a secure process and system. The county
8 treasurer or the department shall issue Wildlife Conservation Plates in
9 lieu of regular license plates when the applicant complies with the other
10 provisions of the Motor Vehicle Registration Act for registration of the
11 motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer. If Wildlife Conservation Plates
12 are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the licensee shall be issued replacement
13 license plates upon request pursuant to section 60-3,157.

14 (4) The owner of a motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer bearing
15 Wildlife Conservation Plates may apply to the county treasurer to have
16 such plates transferred to a motor vehicle other than the vehicle for
17 which such plates were originally purchased if such vehicle is owned by
18 the owner of the plates. The owner may have the unused portion of the fee
19 for the plates credited to the other vehicle which will bear the plates
20 at the rate of eight and one-third percent per month for each full month
21 left in the registration period. Application for such transfer shall be
22 accompanied by a fee of three dollars. Fees collected pursuant to this
23 subsection shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the
24 Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

25 (5) If the cost of manufacturing Wildlife Conservation Plates at any
26 time exceeds the amount charged for license plates pursuant to section
27 60-3,102, any money to be credited to the Game and Parks Commission
28 Educational Fund shall instead be credited first to the Highway Trust
29 Fund in an amount equal to the difference between the manufacturing costs
30 of Wildlife Conservation Plates and the amount charged pursuant to
31 section 60-3,102 with respect to such plates and the remainder shall be

1 credited to the Game and Parks Commission Educational Fund.
