**LEGISLATIVE BILL 143**

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Motor Vehicle Registration Act; to
- 2 amend section 60-363, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016;
- 3 to provide a duty to carry exception for public power district motor
- 4 vehicle or trailer registration certificates; and to repeal the
- 5 original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-363, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,  
2 2016, is amended to read:

3 60-363 (1) No person shall operate or park a motor vehicle on the  
4 highways unless such motor vehicle at all times carries in or upon it,  
5 subject to inspection by any peace officer, the registration certificate  
6 issued for it.

7 (2) No person shall tow or park a trailer on the highways unless the  
8 registration certificate issued for the trailer or a copy thereof is  
9 carried in or upon the trailer or in or upon the motor vehicle that is  
10 towing or parking the trailer, subject to inspection by any peace  
11 officer, except as provided in subsection (4) of this section and except  
12 fertilizer trailers as defined in section 60-326. The registration  
13 certificate for a fertilizer trailer shall be kept at the principal place  
14 of business of the owner of the fertilizer trailer.

15 (3) In the case of a motorcycle, the registration certificate shall  
16 be carried either in plain sight, affixed to the motorcycle, or in the  
17 tool bag or some convenient receptacle attached to the motorcycle.

18 (4) In the case of a motor vehicle or trailer operated by a public  
19 power district registered pursuant to section 60-3,228, the registration  
20 certificate shall be kept at the principal place of business of the  
21 public power district.
