4 Section 1. Section 37-811, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is  
5 amended to read:

6 37-811 There is hereby created the Wildlife Conservation Fund. The  
7 fund shall be used to assist in carrying out the Nongame and Endangered  
8 Species Conservation Act, to pay for research into and management of the  
9 ecological effects of the release, importation, commercial exploitation,  
10 and exportation of wildlife species pursuant to section 37-548, and to  
11 pay any expenses incurred by the Department of Revenue or any other  
12 agency in the administration of the income tax designation program  
13 required by section 77-27,119.01. The fund shall consist of money  
14 credited pursuant to section 23 of this act and any other money as  
15 determined by the Legislature. The fund shall also consist of money Money  
16 ~~shall be transferred into such fund~~ from the General Fund by the State  
17 Treasurer in an amount to be determined by the Tax Commissioner which  
18 shall be equal to the total amount of contributions designated pursuant  
19 to section 77-27,119.01. Any money in the Wildlife Conservation Fund  
20 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment  
21 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska

8 register all such motor vehicles or trailers on a calendar-year basis or  
9 on an annual basis for the same registration period beginning in a month  
10 chosen by the owner. When electing to establish the same registration  
11 period for all such motor vehicles or trailers, the owner shall pay the  
12 registration fee, the motor vehicle tax imposed in section 60-3,185, the  
13 motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190, and the alternative fuel  
14 fee imposed in section 60-3,191 on each motor vehicle for the number of  
15 months necessary to extend its current registration period to the  
16 registration period under which all such motor vehicles or trailers will  
17 be registered. Credit shall be given for registration paid on each motor  
18 vehicle or trailer when the motor vehicle or trailer has a later  
19 expiration date than that chosen by the owner except as otherwise  
20 provided in sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128,  
21 60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,233, and 60-3,235 and sections 24, 26, and 28 of  
22 this act. Thereafter all such motor vehicles or trailers shall be  
23 registered on an annual basis starting in the month chosen by the owner.

29 and 28 of this act, the registration shall expire and the registered  
30 owner or lessee may, by returning the registration certificate, the  
31 license plates, and, when appropriate, the validation decals and by

1 either making application on a form prescribed by the department to the  
2 county treasurer of the occurrence of an event described in subdivisions  
3 (a) through (e) of this subsection or, in the case of a change in situs,

16 and no longer subject to registration fees, the motor vehicle tax imposed  
17 in section 60-3,185, the motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190,  
18 and the alternative fuel fee imposed in section 60-3,191;

19 (e) Upon a trade-in or surrender of a motor vehicle under a lease;  
20 or

21 (f) In case of a change in the situs of a motor vehicle or trailer  
22 to a location outside of this state.

23 (2) If the date of the event falls within the same calendar month in  
24 which the motor vehicle or trailer is acquired, no refund shall be  
25 allowed for such month.

26 (3) If the transferor or lessee acquires another motor vehicle at  
27 the time of the transfer, trade-in, or surrender, the transferor or  
28 lessee shall have the credit provided for in this section applied toward  
29 payment of the motor vehicle fees and taxes then owing. Otherwise, the  
30 transferor or lessee shall file a claim for refund with the county  
31 treasurer upon an application form prescribed by the department.

1 (4) The registered owner or lessee shall make a claim for refund or  
2 credit of the fees and taxes for the unexpired months in the registration  
3 period within sixty days after the date of the event or shall be deemed  
4 to have forfeited his or her right to such refund or credit.

5 (5) For purposes of this section, the date of the event shall be:  
6 (a) In the case of a transfer or loss, the date of the transfer or loss;  
7 (b) in the case of a change in the situs, the date of registration in  
8 another state; (c) in the case of a trade-in or surrender under a lease,  
9 the date of trade-in or surrender; (d) in the case of a legislative act,  
10 the effective date of the act; and (e) in the case of a court decision,  
11 the date the decision is rendered.

12 (6) Application for registration or for reassignment of license  
13 plates and, when appropriate, validation decals to another motor vehicle  
14 or trailer shall be made within thirty days of the date of purchase.

15 (7) If a motor vehicle or trailer was reported stolen under section  
16 60-178, a refund under this section shall not be reduced for a lost plate  
17 charge and a credit under this section may be reduced for a lost plate  
18 charge but the applicant shall not be required to pay the plate fee for  
19 new plates.

20 (8) The county treasurer shall refund the motor vehicle fee and  
21 registration fee from the fees which have not been transferred to the  
22 State Treasurer. The county treasurer shall make payment to the claimant  
23 from the undistributed motor vehicle taxes of the taxing unit where the

28 60-396 Whenever the registered owner files an application with the  
29 county treasurer showing that a motor vehicle, ~~or trailer,~~ or semitrailer  
30 is disabled and has been removed from service, the registered owner may,  
31 by returning the registration certificate, the license plates, and, when

1 appropriate, the validation decals or, in the case of the unavailability  
2 of such registration certificate or certificates, license plates, or  
3 validation decals, then by making an affidavit to the county treasurer of  
4 such disablement and removal from service, receive a credit for a portion  
5 of the registration fee from the fee deposited with the State Treasurer  
6 at the time of registration based upon the number of unexpired months  
7 remaining in the registration year except as otherwise provided in

18 forward the application and affidavit, if any, to the State Treasurer who

22 amount, if any, of the allowable credit and issue a credit certificate to

5 60-3,100 (1) The department shall issue to every person whose motor  
6 vehicle or trailer is registered one or two fully reflectorized license  
7 plates upon which shall be displayed (a) the registration number  
8 consisting of letters and numerals assigned to such motor vehicle or  
9 trailer in figures not less than two and one-half inches nor more than  
10 three inches in height and (b) also the word Nebraska suitably lettered  
11 so as to be attractive. The license plates shall be of a color designated  
12 by the director. The color of the plates shall be changed each time the  
13 license plates are changed. Each time the license plates are changed, the  
14 director shall secure competitive bids for materials pursuant to sections  
15 81-145 to 81-162. Autocycle, motorcycle, minitruck, low-speed vehicle,  
16 and trailer license plate letters and numerals may be one-half the size

10 under section 60-3,198. An applicant receiving a specialty license plate

21 Army, United States Army Reserve, United States Navy, United States Navy  
22 Reserve, United States Marine Corps, United States Marine Corps Reserve,  
23 United States Coast Guard, United States Coast Guard Reserve, United
