- 13 <u>(b) Develop new initiatives to better connect veterans to Nebraska's</u>
- 14 job market and the workforce development needs of employers.
- 15 (3) The position of veterans' program coordinator shall be
- 16 maintained by the Department of Labor. The coordinator shall be a veteran
- 17 and a full-time employee of the Department of Labor and shall:

- 12 (d) Three residents of the State of Nebraska, one from each
- congressional district. At least one of the three residents shall have 13

- 5 fill a vacancy, occurring other than by the expiration of a term of
- 6 office, shall be made for the unexpired term of the member whose office
- 7 is vacated.
