Expansion was launched successfully on October 1, 2020. In November, MLTC continued its planning for the implementation of the Heritage Health Adult (HHA) Demonstration Program on April 1, 2021. The state had a series of implementation-focused calls with the federal government related to planning and reporting requirements. Updates on the HHA Demonstration Program will be shared as they become available.

DHHS Eligibility Operations and Information Systems and Technology (IS&T) continued ongoing support for Medicaid expansion and began planning for the HHA Demonstration program. Eligibility Operations continues to hire and train new staff and improve their work processes to ensure good customer service. IS&T are planning the updates to DHHS's technology systems that will be needed for the HHA Demonstration Program.




Figure 1: HHA Phase II Implementation Timeline
