Annual Report and Resource Guide

July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020

Fiscal year 2020 was filled with challenges and opportunities for the Nebraska Lottery.

Lottery sales reached \$183 million, and transfers to the beneficiary funds were \$42.4 million. These figures are evidence of the appeal of the products, the loyalty of players and retailers, and the efficiency of our organization.

The coronavirus pandemic required business adjustments on short notice and drove initiatives like mobile ticket scanning to the forefront. Scratch games continued to increase in popularity, and the ranks of Nebraska millionaires grew. And work funded with Lottery proceeds received additional attention via a comprehensive marketing campaign. Additional details on these items can be found in this report.

Finally, we continued a long-standing relationship with retailers, who received \$12 million in commissions during the fiscal year. Other highlights for the fiscal year include:

- Collected \$625,275 in state income taxes from prize winnings;
- Collected \$23,296 in unpaid taxes; and
- Collected \$30,631 in unpaid child support.

We look forward to continuing to serve the citizens of our state by providing them with quality entertainment, and by supporting good causes with Lottery proceeds. Together, we are Helping to Build a Better Nebraska®.

General Information

The Nebraska Lottery sells \$1, \$2, \$3, \$5, \$10, and \$20 Scratch tickets, with prizes ranging from a free \$1 ticket up to \$200,000 cash. A variety of Scratch games were developed and offered during the course of the year.

The Nebraska Lottery sells Lotto (online) games such as Lucky for Life[®], Powerball[®], Mega Millions[®], 2by2[®], MyDaY[®], Nebraska Pick 3[®], and Nebraska Pick 5[®]. MyDaY, Nebraska Pick 5, and Nebraska Pick 3 are offered exclusively in Nebraska. Powerball and 2by2 are operated on behalf of member lotteries by the Multi-State Lottery Association; and Lucky for Life and Mega Millions are operated by their member lotteries. Drawings for 2by2 and Nebraska-exclusive Lotto games are held every night. Lucky for Life, Powerball, and Mega Millions drawings are held twice per week. The price for a single play of most games is \$1, except for Lucky for Life, Mega Millions, and Powerball, which are \$2 per play. Lotto prizes range from a free ticket up to a multi-million-dollar jackpot.

Nebraska Lottery Scratch and Lotto game products, equipment, and services are provided by International Game Technology (IGT), which employs 38 people across Nebraska. Tickets and equipment are distributed from the IGT warehouse in Lincoln. The Nebraska Lottery contracts with Smith Kroeger (formerly known as SKAR Advertising) of Omaha for advertising development and marketing-related services. Security and audit services are provided under contract with other Nebraska firms.

There are 21 Nebraska Lottery state employees providing accounting, marketing, communication, information technology, security, and general administrative services.

Operations

COVID-19

Response

As the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic spread across the world, the Nebraska Lottery made several changes to continue to operate while protecting its customers, retailers, and staff.

In March 2020, the Nebraska State Fair office in Grand Island and the Nebraska Department of Revenue offices in Norfolk, North Platte, and Scottsbluff closed to the public due to coronavirus concerns. These locations act as claim centers for in-person Lottery claims. A dedicated page for COVID-19 information was then set up on the Lottery website, nelottery.com. The page provides the latest information on claim center hours, claiming prizes by mail, and safety tips for players. Additional messaging on the website and social media was required when the Powerball and Mega Millions games changed their starting jackpots and roll amounts in April 2020 due to decreased sales and low interest rates.

At Nebraska Lottery Headquarters in Lincoln, continuity of operations plans developed earlier were put into action. Work schedules were adjusted to implement social distancing guidelines in the office, and remote work options were offered. Procedures for interacting with visitors and processing in-person claims were adjusted for safety.

As more directed health measures were put in place across the state, Lottery advertising and social media messaging pivoted away from sales appeals to informational items on lottery beneficiaries and general COVID-19 topics. The May 2020 launch of the ticket scanner feature in the Lottery mobile app was promoted as a way to eliminate extra trips to retailers. The start of the Caesars Scratch game and Second-Chance Promotion was accompanied by a post on The Scratch blog explaining why the game was being launched during the pandemic and the additional considerations offered to the Las Vegas trip winners.

Most Lottery retailers were open for business under the directed health measures. Support for retailers continued, and Lottery Sales Representatives maintained regular contact with their stores via phone or limited in-person visits. Important information on disinfecting lottery equipment and other coronavirus topics was sent out via terminal messages and information sheets. Retailers also shared their photos and experiences serving customers during the pandemic in the May/June issue of the Ticket Talk retailer magazine.

The coronavirus pandemic continues, and its impact our state and our country will be felt for years to come. The Nebraska Lottery has learned several important lessons while responding to the pandemic, and will utilize these lessons as our response continues.

Request for Proposals for Instant and Online Services



On March 26, 2020, the Nebraska Lottery issued a request for proposals for a primary vendor of Instant and Online games and related services. Proposals submitted by the June 12, 2020, deadline were evaluated by a team of six reviewers internal and external to the Lottery.

On August 20, 2020, after several weeks of review, it was announced that International Game Technology (IGT) will continue as its provider of Instant and Online games and related services. The term of the new contract is seven years with three two-year extension options and will commence on July 1, 2021.

Lottery Director Brian Rockey said, “The lottery industry is comprised of highly specialized services, and IGT has been a valued partner for the Nebraska Lottery since 1994. Continuing with IGT as our gaming system vendor fits the mission of the Nebraska Lottery to generate proceeds for good causes while providing quality entertainment options to Nebraskans. Their proposal included many benefits that will aid our work to benefit the environment, education, the Nebraska State Fair, and compulsive gamblers assistance.”

Mobile App Ticket Scanning

An update to the Nebraska Lottery mobile app in May 2020 added one feature often requested by players: ticket scanning.

Scratch and Lotto tickets can be scanned in the app to determine if they have won prizes and display any prize amounts under \$500. This matches the functionality of the Check-A-Ticket devices found at retailers.

The ticket scanner feature was promoted via email, on nelottery.com, and on the Lottery’s social media channels. The number of tickets scanned has averaged around 55,000 per week since launch.



Top Prize Odds on Lottery Advertisements

Legislative Bill 252 was introduced during the 106th session of the Nebraska Legislature and signed into law in May 2019. The law requires that all Lottery advertisements contain the odds of winning the top prize for any games shown in a clear and conspicuous manner. Only advertisements produced after the law went into effect in September 2019 are covered.

Lotto Developments

New Nebraska Millionaires



Two \$1 million Powerball prizes and one \$1 million Mega Millions prize were won by Nebraska Lottery players during the fiscal year.

Daniel Moore of Bellwood won a \$1 million Powerball prize in the August 17, 2019, drawing. Moore purchased his winning ticket at Parkview One Stop at 102 Colfax St. in Schuyler. The ticket contained three quick pick plays, one of which matched all five white ball numbers (18, 21, 24, 30, 60) from the August 17 drawing.

Moore said he's a regular Powerball player and was checking tickets in his truck after work when he discovered he'd won. Moore said he yelled "Thank you," upon discovering he'd hit the \$1 million prize.

"I checked them at the store and the clerk's eyes got really big," he said.

Moore said he's planning on using his winnings to pay off his house and a couple of vehicles, but there's something he wants to do that's a little closer to his heart.

Moore's father died earlier in 2019 and he wanted to buy his dad's excavating business from his mother.

"Dad was looking down on you," Moore's mother told him after his win.

A second \$1 million Powerball winning ticket was sold at Casey's General Store #3819, 16960 Evans Plaza in Omaha for the August 21, 2019, drawing. This ticket was later claimed by HDLS, LLC of Omaha.

A \$1 million Mega Millions winning ticket for the March 24, 2020, drawing was sold at Mai's Market (formerly known as Schmick's Market), 1340 West O Street in Lincoln. This prize was claimed by Robert Vande Guchte of Lincoln on September 15, 2020.

A total of 26 Nebraska Powerball players have won the \$1 million prize since it was added to the game in January 2012. Six Nebraska Mega Millions players have won the \$1 million prize since it was added in October 2013.

Ticket to Tunes Promotion

Vegas or Nashville? Nebraska 2by2 players got the chance to choose between two great American music cities in the Ticket to Tunes You Choose Promotion.

Between February 17 and April 12, 2020, voucher numbers for the promotion were produced with every 2by2 purchase of \$1 or more. Players submitted their vouchers at nelottery.com for a chance to win one of four trip packages – two to Las Vegas and two to Nashville – including hotel, airfare, concert tickets, cash and Lottery tickets.

When entering each of their voucher numbers, players got to choose which trip to enter for – a first for an MVP Club promotion. A total of 316,202 voucher numbers were printed, and 31.27% of these numbers were entered in the promotion. Of the two prize options, the Las Vegas trips were more popular with 63,481 entries compared to 35,404 for the Nashville trips.

Scratch Developments

Sales of Nebraska Lottery Scratch tickets increased 7.32% over the previous fiscal year. Games featuring well-known brands and long-standing player favorites were responsible in part for this success.

Caesars® Scratch Game

The \$5 Caesars Scratch game launched in May 2020. Based on the Las Vegas hotel and casino of the same name, the Caesars Scratch game featured three top prizes of \$40,000. A second-chance promotion for non-winning Caesars tickets offered two VIP trip packages for two to Las Vegas.

Mindful of launching a high-profile game during the coronavirus pandemic, the Lottery produced a blog post to address questions about the timing of the launch and let players know that second-chance winners would have up to one year after the contest to take their trips. 15,300 non-winning tickets were entered in the Caesars second-chance contest between May 18 and July 27, 2020.



25 Years of Truck\$ & Buck\$

In June 1996 a new Nebraska Lottery Scratch game was launched. It was a hit with players looking to instantly win a new truck. 25 years and over 100 trucks later, Truck\$ & Buck\$ still ranks as Nebraska's favorite Scratch game.

To celebrate 25 years of Truck\$ & Buck\$, the Lottery began by asking players what color truck they would like to win in the 25th edition of the game. A poll on the Lottery's Facebook and Instagram accounts in July 2019 generated 463 responses, and the overwhelming truck color choice was silver.



When the game launched in January 2020, it was taller than other \$2 Scratch games and featured 10 chances to win. Seven silver Ford F-150 trucks were offered as top prizes. Julio Olmedo of Schuyler won the first truck on January 21, 2020, only a few weeks after the game launched. The final truck was won by Dean Pawelko of Lincoln on July 31, 2020.



Wheel of Fortune®

Based on the popular game show, the \$5 Wheel of Fortune Scratch game launched in April 2019. Non-winning tickets could be entered online at nelottery.com for a chance to win one of two trips to Los Angeles. Sandra Billings of Washington and Jean Williams of Papillion were the two lucky winners and they travelled to Los Angeles in January 2020. After watching a taping of Wheel of Fortune, lottery winners from across the country had a chance to spin the big wheel for cash prizes. Sandra Billings ended up winning \$6,000, and Jean Williams took home \$6,500.

Retailers

The Nebraska Lottery sells Scratch and Lotto tickets through a retailer network of approximately 1,200 locations statewide. Nebraska Lottery retailers range from convenience stores and truck stops to supermarkets. Nebraska Lottery tickets may not be sold in establishments licensed for the consumption of alcohol. Players must be at least 19 years old to purchase and redeem Nebraska Lottery tickets.

Previous research among retailers found that carrying Lottery tickets is viewed as a customer service by 62% of retailers responding. Another 36% of retailers said they believe Lottery tickets are both a customer service and a profit center for their stores.

During the fiscal year, the Lottery processed 31 new retailer applications and 35 retailer change of ownerships. The statewide sales leaders for the fiscal year are listed here.

Beneficiary Support

Proceeds from the Nebraska Lottery benefit the environment, education, the Nebraska State Fair, and compulsive gamblers assistance. The Nebraska Lottery transferred \$42,405,635 to its beneficiaries during the fiscal year, bringing the overall total to \$782,891,013 since operations began on September 11, 1993.

Amendment 4, passed by Nebraska voters in November 2004, established the following distribution formula:

- Education (44.5%)*, as directed by the Legislature, is currently distributed to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund;
- Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund (44.5%);
- Nebraska State Fair (10%); and
- Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund (1%), plus the first \$500,000 in fund proceeds each fiscal year.

Beneficiary Awareness Campaign

A marketing campaign to promote the statewide benefits of Nebraska Lottery proceeds was launched in January 2020. Messaging focused on how all 93 Nebraska counties benefit from programs funded by Lottery proceeds.

A television commercial produced for the campaign used a lighted map of the state to demonstrate that every county from Sioux in the west to Richardson in the east benefit from the work of Lottery beneficiaries. This message was also used in digital display advertising and social media posts. Targeted billboards in 31 communities featured a design containing all 93 county names. The design was customized to highlight the county where each billboard was located.

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the business-type activities of the Nebraska Department of Revenue, Lottery Division (Nebraska Lottery), as of and for the year ended June 30, 2020, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Nebraska Lottery's basic financial statements, as listed in the Table of Contents.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Nebraska Lottery's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the business-type activities of the Nebraska Lottery, as of June 30, 2020, and the respective changes in financial position and cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Emphasis of Matter

As discussed in Note 1, the financial statements of the Nebraska Lottery are intended to present the financial position and the changes in financial position of only that portion of the business activities of the State that is attributable to the transactions of the Nebraska Lottery. They do not purport to, and do not, present fairly the financial position of the State of Nebraska as of June 30, 2020, and the changes in its financial position, or its cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Other Matters

Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the Management's Discussion and Analysis on pages 7-10 be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Other Information

The statistical section has not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and accordingly, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on it.

Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued our report dated October 5, 2020, on our consideration of the Nebraska Lottery's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is to solely describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the Nebraska Lottery's internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the Nebraska Lottery's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

The accompanying Notes to the Financial Statements are an integral part of this statement.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For The Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2020

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Presentation

The accompanying basic financial statements of the Nebraska Department of Revenue, Lottery Division, (Nebraska Lottery) have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP), as applied to governmental units. As the Nebraska Lottery is a business-type activity, the financial statements presented are the financial statements required by Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement Number 34 for an enterprise fund. GASB is the accepted standard-setting body for establishing governmental accounting and financial reporting principles.

The basic financial statements have been prepared primarily from data maintained by the Nebraska Lottery on computer systems provided by the lottery-services vendor and from accounts maintained by the State Accounting Administrator of the Department of Administrative Services.

B. Reporting Entity

The Nebraska Lottery was created on February 24, 1993, by the Nebraska Legislature as a division of the Nebraska Department of Revenue (Department), established under and governed by the laws of the State of Nebraska. As such, the Nebraska Lottery is exempt from State and Federal income taxes. The financial statements include all funds of the Nebraska Lottery. The Nebraska Lottery is to provide an instant win and a random number selection on-line lottery. The net proceeds, as outlined in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 9-812 (Cum. Supp. 2018), are to be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund, the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, and the Nebraska State Fair Support and Improvement Cash Fund, a fund of the State Fair Board. The financial statements include only the Nebraska Lottery and are not intended to present the financial position of the Department or the results of operations and changes in net positions of the Department as a whole. The Department is part of the primary government for the State of Nebraska's reporting entity.

The Nebraska Lottery has also considered all potential component units for which it is financially accountable, including other organizations that are fiscally dependent on the Nebraska Lottery or whose relationship with the Nebraska Lottery is so significant that exclusion would be misleading or incomplete. GASB has set forth criteria to be considered in determining financial accountability. These criteria include appointing a voting majority of an organization's governing body, and (1) the ability of the Nebraska Lottery to impose its will on that organization, or (2) the potential for the organization to provide specific financial benefits to, or impose specific financial burdens on, the Nebraska Lottery. The Nebraska Lottery is also considered financially accountable if an organization is fiscally dependent on it, and there is potential for the organization to provide specific financial benefits to, or impose specific financial burdens on, the Nebraska Lottery, regardless of whether the organization has (1) a separately elected governing board, (2) a governing board appointed by a higher level of government, or (3) a jointly appointed board.

These financial statements present the Nebraska Lottery. No component units were identified. The Nebraska Lottery is part of the primary government for the State of Nebraska's reporting entity.

C. Measurement Focus, Basis of Accounting

The accounting and financial reporting treatment applied to a fund is determined by its measurement focus and basis of accounting. Basis of accounting refers to when revenues and expenses are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. Basis of accounting relates to the timing of the measurements made, regardless of the measurement focus applied.

The Nebraska Lottery's financial statements were reported using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. With the economic resources measurement focus, all assets and all liabilities associated with the operations are included on the Statement of Net Position. Revenues are recorded when earned, and expenses are recorded when a liability is incurred, regardless of the timing of related cash flows. Net Position is segregated into restricted and unrestricted. The Nebraska Lottery's operating statements present increases (e.g., revenues) and decreases (e.g., expenses) in net position.

It is the policy of the State to spend restricted resources only when unrestricted resources are insufficient or unavailable. When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the Nebraska Lottery's policy to use unrestricted resources first, then restricted resources, as they are needed.

Revenues generated from the sale of lottery tickets are reported as operating revenues. Transactions that are capital financing, non-capital financing, or investing related are reported as non-operating revenues. All expenses related to operating the Nebraska Lottery are reported as operating expenses. All other expenses are reported as non-operating expenses.

Instant ticket revenue is recognized when tickets are sold to the retailer, and on-line revenue is recognized after the drawing is completed for the respective wagers. A 5.0% - 6.0% retailer commission and a prize expense are recognized at the same time. Revenues from the sale of on-line tickets for future drawings and the related agent commission and prize expense are deferred until the drawings are held.

Prize expense is recognized in the same period ticket revenue is recognized based on the predetermined prize structure for each game. Because the instant prize-winning tickets are randomly distributed throughout the tickets, and some winning tickets will be lost, destroyed, or unredeemed for other reasons, there will be differences between amounts accrued and the amounts actually paid. These differences, denoted as unclaimed prizes, are recognized as a reduction of prize expense 181 days after the close of each instant game and 181 days after each draw for on-line games as prizes unclaimed for 180 days expire. Unclaimed prizes for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2020, totaled \$3,294,730.

The activities of the Nebraska Lottery are accounted for as an enterprise fund. Enterprise funds are used to account for governmental operations that are financed and operated in a manner similar to private business enterprises and where the governing body has decided that periodic determination of revenues earned, expenses incurred, and net position is appropriate.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

In addition to bank accounts and petty cash, this classification includes all short-term investments, such as certificates of deposit, repurchase agreements, and U.S. treasury bills. These short-term investments may have original maturities (remaining time to maturity at acquisition) greater than three months; however, cash is available and is considered cash and cash equivalents for reporting purposes. These investments are stated at cost, which at June 30, 2020, approximates market. Banks pledge collateral, as required by law, to guarantee State funds held in time and demand deposits.

Cash and cash equivalents are under the control of the State Treasurer or other administrative bodies, as determined by law. All cash deposited with the State Treasurer is initially maintained in a pooled cash account. On a daily basis, the State Treasurer invests cash not needed for current operations with the State's Investment Council, which maintains an operating investment pool for such investments. Interest earned on these investments is allocated to funds based on their percentage of the investment pool.

E. Budgetary Process

The State's biennial budget cycle ends on June 30 of the odd-numbered years. By September 15, prior to a biennium, the Nebraska Lottery and all other State agencies must submit their budget requests for the biennium beginning the following July 1. The requests are submitted on forms that show estimated funding requirements by programs, sub-programs, and activities. The Executive Branch reviews the requests, establishes priorities, and balances the budget within the estimated resources available during the upcoming biennium.

The Governor's budget bill is submitted to the Legislature in January. The Legislature considers revisions to the bill and presents the appropriations bill to the Governor for signature. The Governor may: a) approve the appropriations bill in its entirety; b) veto the bill; or c) line item veto certain sections of the bill. Any vetoed bill or line item can be overridden by a three-fifths vote of the Legislature.

The approved appropriations will generally set spending limits for a particular program within the agency. Within the agency or program, the Legislature may provide funding from one to five budgetary fund types. Thus, the control is by fund type, within a program, within an agency.

Appropriations are usually made for each year of the biennium, with unexpended balances being reappropriated at the end of the first year of the biennium. For most appropriations, balances lapse at the end of the biennium.

All State budgetary expenditures for the enterprise fund type are made pursuant to the appropriations, which may be amended by the Legislature, upon approval by the Governor. State agencies may reallocate the appropriations between major objects of expenditure accounts, except that the Legislature's approval is required to exceed the personal service limitations contained in the appropriations bill.

Increases in total appropriations must also be approved by the Legislature as a deficit appropriations bill.

Revenues are not budgeted.

F. Receivables

Receivables are reported net of estimated allowances for uncollectible amounts, which are estimated based upon past collection experience and current economic conditions.

G. Capital Assets

Capital assets include equipment that is valued at cost when historical records are available and at estimated historical cost when no historical records exist. Donated capital assets are valued at their estimated fair market value on the date received. Generally, equipment that has a cost in excess of \$5,000 at the date of acquisition and has an expected useful life of more than one year is capitalized. Computers are an exception to this policy and are capitalized if they have a cost in excess of \$1,500 and a useful life of more than one year.

Equipment is depreciated using the straight line method over the estimated useful life of three to seven years.

H. Compensated Absences

All permanent employees working for the Nebraska Lottery earn sick and annual leave and are allowed to accumulate compensatory leave rather than being paid overtime. Temporary and intermittent employees are not eligible for paid leave. The liability has been calculated using the vesting method, in which leave amounts, for both employees currently eligible to receive termination payments and other employees expected to become eligible in the future to receive such payments upon termination, are included.

Nebraska Lottery employees accrue vested annual leave at a variable rate based on years of service. Generally, accrued annual leave cannot exceed 35 days at the end of a calendar year.

Employees accrue sick leave at a variable rate based on years of service. In general, accrued sick leave cannot exceed 180 days. There is no maximum limit on the accumulation of sick leave days for employees under certain labor contracts. Sick leave is not vested except upon either death or reaching the retirement eligibility age of 55, at which time the State is liable for 25 percent of the employee's accumulated sick leave. Employees under certain labor contracts can only be paid a maximum of 50 or 60 days.

The Nebraska Lottery's financial statements recognize the expense and accrued liability when vacation and compensatory leave is earned or when sick leave is expected to be paid as termination payments.

I. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at June 30, 2020, and revenues and expenditures during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

Investment of all available cash is made by the State Investment Officer on a daily basis, based on total bank balances. These funds are held in the State of Nebraska Operating Investment Pool (OIP), an internal investment pool. Additional information on the deposits and investments portfolio, including investment policies, risks, and types of investments, can be found in the State of Nebraska's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR).

3. CONTINGENCIES AND COMMITMENTS

Risk Management. The Nebraska Lottery is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets, errors or omissions, injuries to employees, and natural disasters. The Nebraska Lottery, as part of the primary government for the State, participates in the State's risk management program. The Nebraska Department of Administrative Services is responsible for maintaining the insurance and self-insurance programs for the State. The State generally self-insures for general liability, employee health care, employee indemnification, and workers' compensation. The State has chosen to purchase insurance for:

- A. Motor vehicle liability, which includes \$4,700,000 with a self-insured retention of \$300,000. Insurance is also purchased, with various limits and deductibles, for physical damage and uninsured and underinsured motorists. State agencies have the option to purchase coverage for physical damage to vehicles. There is a \$500 deductible for this coverage.
- B. Life insurance for eligible employees.
- C. Crime coverage, with a limit of \$10,975,000 for each loss and a \$25,000 self-insured retention per incident subject to specific conditions, limits, and exclusions.
- D. Real and personal property on a blanket basis for losses up to \$400,700,000, with a self-insured retention of \$300,000 per loss occurrence. Newly acquired properties are covered up to \$10 million for 120 days, if the property has not been reported. If not reported after 120 days, the property is not covered. The perils of flood, earthquake, and acts of terrorism have various coverage, sub-limits, and self-insurance. State agencies have the option to purchase building contents and inland marine coverage.

Details of the various insurance coverages are available from the Nebraska Department of Administrative Services – Risk Management Division.

No settlements exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three fiscal years. Workers' compensation is funded in the Workers' Compensation Internal Service Fund through assessments on each agency based on total agency payroll and past experience. Tort claims, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets, errors or omissions, and natural disasters would be funded through the State General Fund or by individual agency assessments, as directed by the Legislature, unless covered by purchased insurance. No amounts for estimated claims have been reported in the Nebraska Lottery's financial statements. Health care insurance is funded in the Insurance Trust Funds through a combination of employee and State contributions.

Litigation. The potential amount of liability involved in litigation pending against the Nebraska Lottery, if any, could not be determined at this time. However, it is the Nebraska Lottery's opinion that final settlement of those matters should not have an adverse effect on the Nebraska Lottery's ability to administer current programs. Any judgment against the Nebraska Lottery would have to be processed through the State Claims Board and be approved by the Legislature.

4. STATE EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT PLAN (PLAN)

The single-employer Plan became effective by statute on January 1, 1964. The Plan consists of a defined contribution option and a cash balance benefit and is administered by the Nebraska Public Employees Retirement Systems. The cash balance benefit is a type of defined benefit plan. Each member employed and participating in the retirement system prior to January 1, 2003, elected either to continue participation in the defined contribution option or to begin participation in the cash balance benefit. The defined contribution option is closed to new entrants. All new members of the Plan on and after January 1, 2003, become members of the cash balance benefit. The benefits and funding policy of the Plan is established and can only be amended by the Nebraska Legislature.

All permanent full-time employees are required to begin participation in the retirement system upon employment. Prior to April 2011, all permanent part-time employees, who had attained the age of 20, could exercise the option to begin participation in the retirement system. Effective April 2011, the age requirement decreased to 18.

Contribution. Per statute, each member contributes 4.8% of his or her monthly compensation. The Nebraska Lottery matches the member's contribution at a rate of 156%. The employee's and employer's contributions are kept in separate accounts.

The employee's account is fully vested. The employer's account is fully vested after a total of three years of participation in the system, including credit for participation in another Nebraska governmental plan prior to actual contribution to the Plan.

Defined Contribution Option. Upon attainment of age 55, regardless of service, the retirement allowance is to be equal to the sum of the employee and employer accounts. Members have several forms of payment available, including withdrawals, deferrals, annuities, or a combination of these.

Cash Balance Benefit. Upon attainment of age 55, regardless of service, the retirement allowance shall be equal to the accumulated employee and employer cash balance accounts, including interest credits, annuitized for payment in the normal form. The normal form of payment is single life annuity with five-year certain, payable monthly. Members have the option to convert their member cash balance account to a monthly annuity with built in cost-of-living adjustments of 2.5% annually. Also available are additional forms of payment allowed under the State Plan that are actuarially equivalent to the normal form, including the option of lump-sum or partial lump-sum.

For the fiscal year ended June 30, 2020, employees contributed \$58,165, and the Nebraska Lottery contributed \$90,738. A separate plan report is issued by and can be obtained from the Nebraska Public Employees Retirement System. This report contains full pension-related disclosures.

The State of Nebraska Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) also includes pension-related disclosures. The CAFR report is available from the Nebraska Department of Administrative Services – Accounting Division or on the Nebraska Auditor of Public Accounts' website at auditors.nebraska.gov.

5. RECEIVABLES

Retailers comprised principally of grocery stores, convenience stores, and off-sale liquor stores serve as the primary distribution channel for lottery sales to the general public. No one retailer accounts for a significant amount of the Nebraska Lottery's sales or accounts receivable. Retailers must pay for instant lottery tickets 45 days after activation or when the pack is 70% validated, whichever comes first. Retailers pay for on-line tickets each Wednesday for balances due through the previous Saturday. The retailers' accounts receivable is net of allowance for uncollectible in the amount of \$29,095.

The Nebraska Lottery is a member of the Multi-State Lottery Association (MUSL), which operates games on behalf of participating state lotteries. Each MUSL member sells on-line game tickets through its agents and makes weekly payments to MUSL in an amount equal to each game's prize structure, less amounts retained for prizes paid directly to the winners by each member lottery. MUSL maintains prize reserve funds on some of the games to serve as a contingency reserve to protect from unforeseen prize liabilities. The money in these reserve funds is to be used at the discretion of the MUSL Board of Directors. The prize reserve funds are refundable to MUSL members if MUSL disbands or if a member leaves MUSL. Members leaving MUSL must wait at least one year before receiving their remaining share of the prize reserve funds.

In addition, the Nebraska Lottery has \$306,928 held by MUSL, reported on the Statement of Net Position as Reserves on Deposit (Current), which can be used to pay the Nebraska Lottery's portion of MUSL's operating budget, any MUSL legal expenses, and other expenses incurred by MUSL. These funds are not tied directly to any MUSL game.

The Powerball® and Mega Millions® grand prizes can be paid either as annual installments or as a lump sum cash payment, depending on the selection of the winner when claiming the prize. If the winner selects annual installments, MUSL purchases bonds, which are held in trust to fund the future installments. Maturities are staggered in order to provide adequate cash flow for each installment. MUSL is responsible for paying amounts owed to the grand prize winners. The assets and related liabilities are reflected in MUSL's financial statements and, therefore, are not reflected in the Nebraska Lottery's financial statements.

The Lucky for Life® top two prize levels can be paid either through annuity payments for the life of the winner or as a lump sum cash payment, depending on the selection of the winner when claiming the prize. If a Nebraska winner selects the annuity, the Nebraska Lottery has a contract with MUSL so that MUSL will secure bids from financial services companies to provide the annual payments directly to the winner. Each participating jurisdiction contributes a proportionate share to fund the annuity or lump sum payment. There were no Lucky for Life® top prize winners in Nebraska this fiscal year.

9. LEASE COMMITMENTS

The Nebraska Lottery leases office space under an operating lease. The following schedule for operating leases includes all leases for the Nebraska Lottery. Although the lease terms may vary, all leases are subject to annual appropriation by the Legislature.

The Nebraska Lottery has the option to extend the lease agreement by two 5-year periods for a total additional period of 10 years. Total operating lease payments for the year ended June 30, 2020, were \$79,679.

10. SIGNIFICANT COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

Article III, § 24, of the Nebraska Constitution sets out the basic requirements for the transfer of lottery proceeds to certain beneficiary funds, specifying that a portion of those revenues are to “be used for education as the Legislature may direct.”

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 9-812(2) (Cum. Supp. 2018) offers the following legislative directive for the transfer of lottery proceeds:

A portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund as provided in subsection (3) of this section. The dollar amount transferred pursuant to this subsection shall equal the greater of (a) the dollar amount transferred to the funds in fiscal year 2002-03 or (b) any amount which constitutes at least twenty-two percent and no more than twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis. To the extent that funds are available, the Tax Commissioner and director may authorize a transfer exceeding twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets sold on an annualized basis.

Additionally, § 9-812(3) provides these further instructions:

Of the money available to be transferred to the Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund:

(a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section 9-1006;

(b) Beginning July 1, 2016, forty-four and one-half percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund;

(c) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund to be used as provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act;

(d) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska State Fair Board if the most populous city within the county in which the fair is located provides matching funds equivalent to ten percent of the funds available for transfer. Such matching funds may be obtained from the city and any other private or public entity, except that no portion of such matching funds shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair ceases operations, ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the General Fund; and

(e) One percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section 9-1006.

As required under its enabling legislation, transfers of \$42,405,635 were made to other funds during the fiscal year.

The Nebraska Lottery develops game structures to comply with the minimum prize provision of its enabling legislation, which requires a minimum of 40 percent to be paid in prizes.

The Nebraska Lottery compares the social security number of each winner who has a per-wager prize in excess of \$500 against a list of social security numbers having an outstanding State tax liability or delinquent child support payments. Any delinquent payments are withheld from winnings and forwarded to the appropriate State agency. During the fiscal year, the Nebraska Lottery collected \$22,696 in delinquent State taxes and \$30,631 in delinquent child support payments.

Operating Transfers In/Out will not balance, and Due To/From Other Funds will not balance, within the Nebraska Lottery's financial statements, as the Nebraska Lottery represents only part of the State's primary government.

11. NET POSITION

The Nebraska Lottery's unrestricted net position represents funds not legally restricted for any specific purpose; however, the funds may be used only to fund additional prize pay-outs, transfers to the beneficiary funds, or additional operating expenses of the Nebraska Lottery. Management's intention is to use the unrestricted net position to fund additional prize pay-outs, retailer incentives, and other game enhancements.
