Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 200 would prevent the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) from denying the issuance or renewal of a license under the Health Care Facility Licensure Act if an alcoholism center utilizes locked rooms to provide civil protective custody services, provided the alcoholism center is otherwise in compliance with DHHS rules and regulations. The person placed into civil protective custody can only be kept in a locked room until the person is no longer a danger to themselves or others and no more than 24 hours.

LB 200 also makes minor language changes to the sections defining public and quasi-public property.

Explanation of amendments:

AM 90 strikes each occurrence of "alcoholism center" and replaces that term with "mental health substance use treatment center." (Page 2, line 11 and Page 3, lines 4, 6, 8, and 10.)

It also amends Sec.1(6) to insert a new subsection (a) that cross references the meaning of "mental health substance use treatment center" to that found in section 71-423. (Page 3, after line 11.)
