Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB44 would eliminate the Class I felony, which authorizes imposition of the death

penalty. The bill would also eliminate or repeal sections and provisions of law related to imposition of the death penalty.

The overwhelming majority of changes in the bill involve deleting statutory references to the procedures involved in sentencing someone to death and carrying out the execution.

Section 29 provides that it is the intent of the Legislature that any death penalty sentences that have not yet been carried out would be converted to life imprisonment.
