**Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.**

This bill requires the Office of Juvenile Services to report escapes, assaults, attempted suicides, self-harm, property damage, use of mechanical restraints, significant medical events and internally substantiated violations of the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act to the Office of Inspector General Child Welfare. The Department of Health and Human Services is required to file quarterly reports to the Office of Inspector General for Child Welfare on the number of grievances filed by each YRTC, the category of grievances and the process for addressing grievances. The Office of the Inspector General for Child Welfare would also conduct annual reviews and physical inspections of all state-run facilities. As amended, Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Center Special Oversight Committee is created. The Executive Board of the Legislature would appoint no more than eleven members. The Committee terminates on December 31, 2020.

The Department of Health and Human Services can handle the reporting requirements within existing agency resources.

The estimated cost for the Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Center Special Oversight Committee is \$5,000. These costs can be absorbed within existing agency resources.

**Explanation of Estimate:**

This legislation requires the Office of Juvenile Services to report all escapes, assaults, attempted suicides, self-harm by a juvenile, property damage, use of mechanical restraints, significant medical events, internally substantiated violations of 34 U.S.C. 30301 (PREA), and of any leadership changes at the YRTCs. This legislation also requires the Department to report quarterly the number of grievances filed at each YRTC, a categorization of issues to which the grievance relates, the process for addressing the grievance, and any action taken as a result of the grievance. The Office of Public Counsel shall conduct an annual review and physical inspection of all state-run facilities to include: YRTC-G, YRTC-K, HRC, LRC, NRC, and BSDC.

The Department will be able to provide this report within the current appropriation. Therefore, this bill will have no fiscal impact on the Department of Health and Human Services
