Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB563 would implement the Access College Early (ACE) Tech Promise Program under which financial aid is to be awarded to students that meet eligibility criteria as specified in the bill. Students who have been awarded or qualified for scholarships under the existing Access College Early (ACE) Scholarship Program and enroll in an in-demand occupation program of study (as determined each biennium by Nebraska Community College Student Performance and Occupational Education Grant Committee) would be eligible to receive scholarships under the proposed program. The bill assigns administrative responsibility for the newly created financial aid program to the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education (CCPE).

LB563 establishes both maximum and minimum levels of financial aid that may be awarded to individual qualifying students under the proposed ACE Tech Promise Program. Awards are not to exceed the sum of tuition and fees plus \$1,500 minus the amount of any federal Pell grant awarded to a qualifying student. The minimum award under the program is established at \$1,500. Eligible students are to receive awards for no more than two academic years.

Based on data relating to 2015-16 and 2016-17 ACE Scholarship recipients, and utilizing assumptions with respect to the number of such students that would qualify and apply for ACE Tech Promise Scholarships, CCPE estimates required funding for related financial aid would amount to \$225,000 for 2019-20 and \$406,500 for 2020-21 based upon the minimum ACE Tech Promise Scholarship amount as provided in LB563. Additionally, CCPE indicates the agency will incur operating expenses in administering the ACE Tech Promise Program primarily to support a 0.5 FTE staff position to administer the newly created program. In summary, CCPE estimates funding requirements, given assumptions as noted above, for the proposed ACE Tech Promise Program as follows:

Given the agency's assumptions as noted above (particularly as they relate to student aid awards based on the minimum level as provided by LB563), the Coordinating Commission estimates with respect to the fiscal impact of LB563 generally appear reasonable. Student aid awards at or approaching the maximum level as provided by LB563 would require additional aid funding. Appropriations at levels insufficient to satisfy all ACE Tech Promise aid applications at the designated minimum aid level for a given fiscal year would require CCPE to reject aid applications received after depletion of related appropriations for that fiscal year. Insofar that no alternative source of funding is designated in the provisions of LB563, the source of funding for the proposed program is assumed as General Funds.
