1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to government; to amend sections 37-811 and
2 60-3,127, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 60-301,
3 60-393, 60-395, 60-396, 60-3,100, 60-3,104, 60-3,104.01, 60-3,119,
4 60-3,122.03, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128, 60-3,130.04, 60-3,226, 60-3,227,
5 60-3,230, 60-3,231, 60-3,232, 60-3,233, 60-3,234, and 60-3,235,
6 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2018; to provide funding for
7 the Wildlife Conservation Fund; to change provisions relating to fee
8 distribution, fee amounts, and semitrailers under the Motor Vehicle
9 Registration Act; to provide powers and duties to the Department of
10 Motor Vehicles regarding discontinuance of certain license plates as
11 prescribed; to provide for Wildlife Conservation Plates, Prostate
12 Cancer Awareness Plates, and Sammy's Superheroes license plates; to
13 eliminate obsolete provisions; to harmonize provisions; and to
14 repeal the original sections.
15 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 37-811, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
2 amended to read:

3 37-811 There is hereby created the Wildlife Conservation Fund. The
4 fund shall be used to assist in carrying out the Nongame and Endangered
5 Species Conservation Act, to pay for research into and management of the
6 ecological effects of the release, importation, commercial exploitation,
7 and exportation of wildlife species pursuant to section 37-548, and to
8 pay any expenses incurred by the Department of Revenue or any other
9 agency in the administration of the income tax designation program
10 required by section 77-27,119.01. The fund shall consist of money
11 credited pursuant to section 24 of this act and any other money as
12 determined by the Legislature. The fund shall also consist of money Money
13 ~~shall be transferred into such fund~~ from the General Fund by the State
14 Treasurer in an amount to be determined by the Tax Commissioner which
15 shall be equal to the total amount of contributions designated pursuant
16 to section 77-27,119.01. Any money in the Wildlife Conservation Fund
17 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment
18 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
19 State Funds Investment Act. ~~Money remaining in the Nongame and Endangered~~
20 ~~Species Conservation Fund on September 1, 2007, shall be transferred to~~
21 ~~the Wildlife Conservation Fund on such date.~~

24 60-301 Sections 60-301 to 60-3,235 and sections 23, 24, 25, 26, 27,
25 and 28 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Motor Vehicle
26 Registration Act.

27 Sec. 3. Section 60-393, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
28 2018, is amended to read:

29 60-393 Any owner who has two or more motor vehicles or trailers
30 required to be registered under the Motor Vehicle Registration Act may
31 register all such motor vehicles or trailers on a calendar-year basis or

1 on an annual basis for the same registration period beginning in a month
2 chosen by the owner. When electing to establish the same registration
3 period for all such motor vehicles or trailers, the owner shall pay the
4 registration fee, the motor vehicle tax imposed in section 60-3,185, the
5 motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190, and the alternative fuel
6 fee imposed in section 60-3,191 on each motor vehicle for the number of
7 months necessary to extend its current registration period to the
8 registration period under which all such motor vehicles or trailers will
9 be registered. Credit shall be given for registration paid on each motor
10 vehicle or trailer when the motor vehicle or trailer has a later
11 expiration date than that chosen by the owner except as otherwise
12 provided in sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128,
13 60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,233, and 60-3,235 and sections 24, 26, and 28 of
14 this act. Thereafter all such motor vehicles or trailers shall be
15 registered on an annual basis starting in the month chosen by the owner.

18 60-395 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this
19 section and sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128,
20 60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,231, 60-3,233, and 60-3,235 and sections 24, 26,
21 and 28 of this act, the registration shall expire and the registered
22 owner or lessee may, by returning the registration certificate, the
23 license plates, and, when appropriate, the validation decals and by
24 either making application on a form prescribed by the department to the
25 county treasurer of the occurrence of an event described in subdivisions
26 (a) through (e) of this subsection or, in the case of a change in situs,
27 displaying to the county treasurer the registration certificate of such
28 other state as evidence of a change in situs, receive a refund of that
29 part of the unused fees and taxes on motor vehicles or trailers based on
30 the number of unexpired months remaining in the registration period from
31 the date of any of the following events:

1 (a) Upon transfer of ownership of any motor vehicle or trailer;

2 (b) In case of loss of possession because of fire, theft,
3 dismantlement, or junking;

4 (c) When a salvage branded certificate of title is issued;

5 (d) Whenever a type or class of motor vehicle or trailer previously
6 registered is subsequently declared by legislative act or court decision
7 to be illegal or ineligible to be operated or towed on the public roads
8 and no longer subject to registration fees, the motor vehicle tax imposed
9 in section 60-3,185, the motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190,
10 and the alternative fuel fee imposed in section 60-3,191;

11 (e) Upon a trade-in or surrender of a motor vehicle under a lease;
12 or

13 (f) In case of a change in the situs of a motor vehicle or trailer
14 to a location outside of this state.

15 (2) If the date of the event falls within the same calendar month in
16 which the motor vehicle or trailer is acquired, no refund shall be
17 allowed for such month.

18 (3) If the transferor or lessee acquires another motor vehicle at
19 the time of the transfer, trade-in, or surrender, the transferor or
20 lessee shall have the credit provided for in this section applied toward
21 payment of the motor vehicle fees and taxes then owing. Otherwise, the
22 transferor or lessee shall file a claim for refund with the county
23 treasurer upon an application form prescribed by the department.

24 (4) The registered owner or lessee shall make a claim for refund or
25 credit of the fees and taxes for the unexpired months in the registration
26 period within sixty days after the date of the event or shall be deemed
27 to have forfeited his or her right to such refund or credit.

28 (5) For purposes of this section, the date of the event shall be:

29 (a) In the case of a transfer or loss, the date of the transfer or loss;

30 (b) in the case of a change in the situs, the date of registration in
31 another state; (c) in the case of a trade-in or surrender under a lease,

1 the date of trade-in or surrender; (d) in the case of a legislative act,
2 the effective date of the act; and (e) in the case of a court decision,
3 the date the decision is rendered.

4 (6) Application for registration or for reassignment of license
5 plates and, when appropriate, validation decals to another motor vehicle
6 or trailer shall be made within thirty days of the date of purchase.

7 (7) If a motor vehicle or trailer was reported stolen under section
8 60-178, a refund under this section shall not be reduced for a lost plate
9 charge and a credit under this section may be reduced for a lost plate
10 charge but the applicant shall not be required to pay the plate fee for
11 new plates.

12 (8) The county treasurer shall refund the motor vehicle fee and
13 registration fee from the fees which have not been transferred to the
14 State Treasurer. The county treasurer shall make payment to the claimant
15 from the undistributed motor vehicle taxes of the taxing unit where the
16 tax money was originally distributed. No refund of less than two dollars
17 shall be paid.

20 60-396 Whenever the registered owner files an application with the
21 county treasurer showing that a motor vehicle, ~~or trailer,~~ or semitrailer
22 is disabled and has been removed from service, the registered owner may,
23 by returning the registration certificate, the license plates, and, when
24 appropriate, the validation decals or, in the case of the unavailability
25 of such registration certificate or certificates, license plates, or
26 validation decals, then by making an affidavit to the county treasurer of
27 such disablement and removal from service, receive a credit for a portion
28 of the registration fee from the fee deposited with the State Treasurer
29 at the time of registration based upon the number of unexpired months
30 remaining in the registration year except as otherwise provided in

6 the credit may be immediately applied against the registration fee and
7 the motor vehicle tax and fee for the replacement motor vehicle, ~~or~~
8 trailer, or semitrailer. When no such replacement motor vehicle, ~~or~~
9 trailer, or semitrailer is so registered, the county treasurer shall
10 forward the application and affidavit, if any, to the State Treasurer who
11 shall determine the amount, if any, of the allowable credit for the
12 registration fee and issue a credit certificate to the owner. For the
13 motor vehicle tax and fee, the county treasurer shall determine the
14 amount, if any, of the allowable credit and issue a credit certificate to
15 the owner. When such motor vehicle, ~~or trailer,~~ or semitrailer is removed
16 from service within the same month in which it was registered, no credits
17 shall be allowed for such month. The credits may be applied against taxes
18 and fees for new or replacement motor vehicles, ~~or trailers,~~ or
19 semitrailers incurred within one year after cancellation of registration
20 of the motor vehicle, ~~or trailer,~~ or semitrailer for which the credits
21 were allowed. When any such motor vehicle, ~~or trailer,~~ or semitrailer is
22 reregistered within the same registration year in which its registration

24 registration fee and the motor vehicle tax and fee for the remainder of
25 the registration year.

27 2018, is amended to read:

28 60-3,100 (1) The department shall issue to every person whose motor
29 vehicle or trailer is registered one or two fully reflectorized license
30 plates upon which shall be displayed (a) the registration number
31 consisting of letters and numerals assigned to such motor vehicle or

1 trailer in figures not less than two and one-half inches nor more than
2 three inches in height and (b) also the word Nebraska suitably lettered
3 so as to be attractive. The license plates shall be of a color designated
4 by the director. The color of the plates shall be changed each time the
5 license plates are changed. Each time the license plates are changed, the
6 director shall secure competitive bids for materials pursuant to sections
7 81-145 to 81-162. Autocycle, motorcycle, minitruck, low-speed vehicle,
8 and trailer license plate letters and numerals may be one-half the size
9 of those required in this section.

10 (2)(a) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, two license
11 plates shall be issued for every motor vehicle.

12 (b) One license plate shall be issued for (i) apportionable
13 vehicles, (ii) buses, (iii) dealers, (iv) minitrucks, (v) motorcycles,
14 other than autocycles, (vi) special interest motor vehicles that use the
15 special interest motor vehicle license plate authorized by and issued
16 under section 60-3,135.01, (vii) trailers, and (viii) truck-tractors.

17 (c)(i) ~~One Beginning January 1, 2017,~~ one license plate shall be
18 issued, upon request and compliance with this subdivision, for any
19 passenger car which is not manufactured to be equipped with a bracket on
20 the front of the vehicle to display a license plate. A license decal
21 shall be issued with the license plate as provided in subdivision (ii) of
22 this subdivision and shall be displayed on the driver's side of the
23 windshield. In order to request a single license plate and license decal,
24 there shall be an additional annual nonrefundable registration fee of
25 fifty one hundred dollars plus the cost of the decal paid to the county
26 treasurer at the time of registration. All fees collected under this
27 subdivision shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the
28 Highway Trust Fund.

29 (ii) The department shall design, procure, and furnish to the county

1 treasurer shall furnish a license decal to the person obtaining the
2 plate.

3 (d) When two license plates are issued, one shall be prominently
4 displayed at all times on the front and one on the rear of the registered
5 motor vehicle or trailer. When only one plate is issued, it shall be
6 prominently displayed on the rear of the registered motor vehicle or
7 trailer. When only one plate is issued for motor vehicles registered
8 pursuant to section 60-3,198 and truck-tractors, it shall be prominently
9 displayed on the front of the apportionable vehicle.

1 trailer, or semitrailer, except for motor vehicles or trailers registered
2 under section 60-3,198. An applicant receiving a specialty license plate
3 for a farm truck with a gross weight of over sixteen tons or for a
4 commercial motor vehicle registered for a gross weight of five tons or
5 over shall affix the appropriate tonnage decal to the plate. The

14 Reserve, United States Marine Corps, United States Marine Corps Reserve,
15 United States Coast Guard, United States Coast Guard Reserve, United

18 reflecting its official emblem, official seal, or other official image.
