- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Pesticide Act; to amend section 2-2642,
- 2 Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019; to change noncertified applicator
- 3 pesticide use restrictions; to provide for unlimited license
- 4 examination attempts; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the
- 5 original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 2-2642, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 2-2642 (1) Each commercial, noncommercial, and private applicator
- 4 license shall expire on April 15 following the third year in which it was
- 5 issued.
- 6 (2) Except as provided by subsection (3) of this section, a person
- 7 having a valid commercial or noncommercial applicator license may renew
- 8 the license for another three-year period by:
- 9 (a) Paying to the department an amount equal to the license fee
- 10 required by section 2-2638 for commercial applicator licenses or section
- 11 2-2639 for noncommercial applicator licenses, if any; and
- 12 (b)(i) Undertaking the training approved by the department; or
- 13 (ii) Submitting to retesting prior to renewal of the license.
- 14 (3) Any person who allows his or her commercial or noncommercial
- 15 applicator license to expire shall be required to submit to testing prior
- 16 to the renewal of the license.
- 17 (4)(a) (4) A noncertified applicator required by the Pesticide Act
- 18 to be a licensed certified commercial or noncommercial applicator may use
- 19 general-use pesticides as a noncertified applicator prior to obtaining an
- 20 initial license for only one consecutive one hundred twenty-day sixty-day
- 21 period of time if:
- 22 (i) (a) The individual or his or her employer applies to the
- 23 department for a license as a licensed certified applicator within ten
- 24 days of making the first pesticide use. Such license application shall
- 25 include the name and license number of the licensed certified applicator
- 26 who is supervising the noncertified applicator;
- 27 <u>(ii)</u> (b) All pesticide uses made by an individual as a noncertified
- 28 applicator are made under the direct supervision of a licensed certified
- 29 applicator meeting the requirements of 40 C.F.R. 171.201;
- 30 (iii) (c) The noncertified applicator has received training meeting
- 31 the requirements of 40 C.F.R. 171.201; and

- 1 (iv) (d) The supervising certified applicator remains accessible by 2 voice or electronic means to provide further instructions at all times during the noncertified applicator's use of the pesticide and is able to 3 be physically on the site, should the need arise, where the pesticide use 4 5 or storage is taking place within a reasonable period of time as established by the director by rules and regulations. Both the licensed 6 certified applicator and noncertified applicator shall be responsible for 7 the acts of the noncertified applicator and each shall be subject to all 8 9 fines, license actions, and other enforcement actions prescribed by the Pesticide Act for violations under the act. The department may deny or 10 suspend the use of pesticides by a noncertified applicator if it has 11 reasonable cause to believe that such person may not become eligible to 12 become a licensed certified applicator or uses any pesticide in violation 13 of the act. 14
- (b) A person applying for a license pursuant to this subsection may

 make an unlimited number of attempts to pass the applicable examination

 required under sections 2-2637 and 2-2640 during the consecutive one

 hundred twenty-day period.
- (5)(a) (5) A noncertified applicator required by the Pesticide Act to be a licensed certified commercial or noncommercial applicator may use a restricted-use pesticide which is not a fumigant, sodium cyanide, or sodium fluoroacetate as a noncertified applicator prior to obtaining an initial license for only one consecutive one hundred twenty-day sixty-day period of time if:
- 25 <u>(i)</u> (a) The noncertified applicator complies with the requirements 26 of subsection (4) of this section; and
- 27 <u>(ii) (b)</u> The noncertified applicator does not apply the restricted-28 use pesticides aerially.
- (b) A person applying for a license pursuant to this subsection may
 make an unlimited number of attempts to pass the applicable examination
 required under sections 2-2637 and 2-2640 during the consecutive one

- 1 <u>hundred twenty-day period.</u>
- 2 (6) A noncertified applicator required by the Pesticide Act to be a
- 3 licensed certified private applicator may apply restricted-use pesticides
- 4 for the purpose of producing agricultural commodities on property owned
- 5 or rented by his or her immediate family for one consecutive twenty-four-
- 6 month period if:
- 7 (a) The noncertified applicator is at least sixteen years of age and
- 8 working under the direct supervision of a licensed private applicator who
- 9 is an immediate family member;
- 10 (b) The noncertified applicator has received training through a
- 11 training session meeting the requirements of 40 C.F.R. 171.201; and
- 12 (c) The supervising certified applicator is in compliance with the
- 13 requirements of 40 C.F.R. 171.201.
