- 2 83-189 and 83-190, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
- 3 membership provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 83-189, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 amended to read:
- 3 83-189 The Board of Parole shall consist of five full-time members
- 4 to be appointed by the Governor. The members of the board shall be of
- 5 good character and judicious temperament. The members of the board shall
- 6 have all the powers and duties of board members commencing on the date of
- 7 appointment. The appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the
- 8 Legislature at its next regular session following the appointments. At
- 9 least one member of the board shall be of an ethnic minority group, at
- 10 least one member shall be female, and at least one member shall have a
- 11 professional background in corrections. <u>Beginning with members appointed</u>
- 12 <u>in 2020, at least one member of the board shall have experience as a</u>
- 13 professional treating mental illness or substance abuse.
- 14 <u>The One of the five</u> members of the board shall <u>elect one member to</u>
- 15 <u>serve a four-year term</u> be designated as chairperson by the Governor. In
- 16 addition to the chairperson's duties as a member of the board as
- 17 prescribed in subsection (1) of section 83-192, he or she shall supervise
- 18 the administration and operation of the board and shall carry out the
- 19 duties prescribed in subsection (2) of such section.
- 20 Sec. 2. Section 83-190, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 21 amended to read:
- 22 83-190 The members of the Board of Parole appointed for terms
- 23 beginning prior to January 1, 2019, shall have terms of office of six
- 24 years, and the members appointed for terms beginning after January 1,
- 25 2019, shall have terms of office of eight years and until their
- 26 successors are appointed. The successors shall be appointed in the same
- 27 manner as provided for the members first appointed, and a vacancy
- 28 occurring before expiration of a term of office shall be similarly filled
- 29 for the unexpired term. A member of the board may <u>not</u>be reappointed <u>for</u>
- 30 a consecutive term.
- 31 The members of the board may be removed only for disability, neglect

- 1 of duty, or malfeasance in office by the Board of Pardons after a
- 2 hearing. The Board of Pardons shall promptly file in the office of the
- 3 Secretary of State a complete statement of the charges, its findings and
- 4 disposition, and a complete record of the proceedings.
- 5 Sec. 3. Original sections 83-189 and 83-190, Reissue Revised
- 6 Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
