- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to child care; to amend sections 71-1962,
- 2 77-3603, and 77-3605, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and
- 3 section 43-2606, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2018; to
- 4 change provisions relating to the Nebraska Early Childhood
- 5 Professional Record System; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal
- 6 the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 43-2606, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2018, is amended to read:
- 3 43-2606 (1) The Department of Health and Human Services shall adopt
- 4 and promulgate rules and regulations for mandatory training requirements
- 5 for providers of child care and school-age-care programs. Such
- 6 requirements shall include preservice orientation and at least four hours
- 7 of annual inservice training. All child care programs required to be
- 8 licensed under section 71-1911 shall show completion of a preservice
- 9 orientation approved or delivered by the department prior to receiving a
- 10 provisional license.
- 11 (2) <u>Beginning January 1, 2020, the department shall use the Nebraska</u>
- 12 Early Childhood Professional Record System created under section 71-1962
- 13 to (a) document the training levels of staff in specific child care
- 14 <u>settings to assist parents in selecting optimal care settings and (b)</u>
- 15 <u>verify minimum training requirements of employees of a program defined in</u>
- 16 section 71-1910 The department shall initiate a system of documenting the
- 17 training levels of staff in specific child care settings to assist
- 18 parents in selecting optimal care settings.
- 19 (3) The training requirements shall be designed to meet the health,
- 20 safety, and developmental needs of children and shall be tailored to the
- 21 needs of licensed providers of child care programs. Preservice
- 22 orientation and the training requirements for providers of child care
- 23 programs shall include, but not be limited to, information on sudden
- 24 unexpected infant death syndrome, shaken baby syndrome, and child abuse.
- 25 (4) The department shall provide or arrange for training
- 26 opportunities throughout the state and shall provide information
- 27 regarding training opportunities to all providers of child care programs
- 28 at the time of registration or licensure, when renewing a registration,
- 29 or on a yearly basis following licensure.
- 30 (5) Each provider of child care and school-age-care programs
- 31 receiving orientation or training shall provide his or her social

- 1 security number to the department.
- 2 (6) The department shall review and provide recommendations to the
- 3 Governor for updating rules and regulations adopted and promulgated under
- 4 this section at least every five years.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 71-1962, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 6 amended to read:
- 7 71-1962 (1) Not later than March 1, 2014, the State Department of
- 8 Education shall create and operate the Nebraska Early Childhood
- 9 Professional Record System. The system shall be designed in order to:
- 10 (a) Establish a data base of Nebraska's early childhood education
- 11 workforce;
- 12 (b) Verify educational degrees and professional credentials held and
- 13 relevant training completed by employees of participating applicable
- 14 child care and early childhood education programs; and
- 15 (c) Provide such information to the Department of Health and Human
- 16 Services for use in evaluating applications to be rated at a step above
- 17 step one under section 71-1959.
- 18 (2) When an applicable child care or early childhood education
- 19 program participating in the quality rating and improvement system
- 20 developed pursuant to section 71-1955 applies under section 71-1959 to be
- 21 rated at a step above step one, the child care or early childhood
- 22 education program shall report the educational degrees and professional
- 23 credentials held and relevant training completed by its child care and
- 24 early childhood education employees to the Nebraska Early Childhood
- 25 Professional Record System for the program to be eligible for a quality
- 26 scale rating above step one.
- 27 (3) Beginning January 1, 2020, a program as defined in section
- 28 71-1910 shall maintain a provider profile in the Nebraska Early Childhood
- 29 <u>Professional Record System, and each employee of such program shall</u>
- 30 report his or her educational degrees and professional credentials held,
- 31 relevant training completed, and work history to the Nebraska Early

- 1 Childhood Professional Record System.
- 2 (4) (3) Any child care or early childhood education provider
- 3 residing or working in Nebraska may report his or her educational degrees
- 4 and professional credentials held, relevant training completed, and work
- 5 history to the Nebraska Early Childhood Professional Record System.
- 6 (5) (4) The State Department of Education shall develop a
- 7 classification system for all employees of applicable child care and
- 8 early childhood education programs listed in the Nebraska Early Childhood
- 9 Professional Record System. The classification system shall be based on
- 10 the employees' educational degrees and professional credentials held,
- 11 relevant training completed, and work history and shall be made up of
- 12 four levels, with level one being the least qualified and level four
- 13 being the most qualified. The minimum qualification for an employee to be
- 14 classified as level one shall be a Child Development Associate Credential
- or a one-year certificate or diploma in early childhood education or
- 16 child development. The classification system shall be used for purposes
- 17 of the tax credit granted in section 77-3605.
- 18 Sec. 3. Section 77-3603, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 19 amended to read:
- 20 77-3603 For purposes of the School Readiness Tax Credit Act:
- 21 (1) Child means an individual who is five years of age or less;
- 22 (2) Child care and education provider means a person who owns or
- 23 operates an eligible program;
- 24 (3) Department means the Department of Revenue;
- 25 (4) Eligible program means an applicable child care and early
- 26 childhood education program as defined in section 71-1954 that has
- 27 applied to participate in the quality rating and improvement system
- 28 developed under the Step Up to Quality Child Care Act and has been
- 29 assigned a quality scale rating;
- 30 (5) Eligible staff member means an individual who is employed with
- 31 an eligible program for at least six months of the taxable year and who

- 1 is listed in the Nebraska Early Childhood Professional Record System and
- 2 classified as provided in subsection (5) (4) of section 71-1962. Eligible
- 3 staff member does not include certificated teaching and administrative
- 4 staff employed by programs established pursuant to section 79-1104; and
- 5 (6) Quality scale rating means the rating of an eligible program
- 6 under the Step Up to Quality Child Care Act which is expressed in terms
- 7 of steps, with step one being the lowest rating and step five being the
- 8 highest rating.
- 9 Sec. 4. Section 77-3605, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 10 amended to read:
- 11 77-3605 (1) An eligible staff member may apply to the department to
- 12 receive a refundable tax credit against the income tax imposed by the
- 13 Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967. The amount of the credit shall be based on
- 14 the eligible staff member's classification under subsection (5) (4) of
- 15 section 71-1962 as follows:
- 16 Eligible Staff Member's Classification Tax Credit
- 17 Level Four \$1,500
- 18 Level Three \$1,250
- 19 Level Two \$750
- 20 Level One \$500
- 21 (2) An eligible staff member shall apply for the credit provided in
- 22 this section by submitting an application to the department with the
- 23 following information:
- 24 (a) The eligible staff member's name and place of employment;
- 25 (b) An attestation form provided by the Nebraska Early Childhood
- 26 Professional Record System verifying the level at which the eligible
- 27 staff member is classified under subsection (5) (4) of section 71-1962;
- 28 and
- 29 (c) Any other documentation required by the department.
- 30 (3) Subject to subsection (4) of this section, if the department
- 31 determines that the eligible staff member qualifies for tax credits under

1 this section, it shall approve the application and certify the amount of

- 2 credits approved to the eligible staff member.
- 3 (4) The department shall consider applications in the order in which
- 4 they are received and may approve tax credits under this section in any
- 5 taxable year until the aggregate limit allowed under subsection (1) of
- 6 section 77-3606 has been reached.
- 7 (5) The credit provided in this section shall be available for
- 8 taxable years beginning or deemed to begin on or after January 1, 2017,
- 9 and before January 1, 2022, under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
- 10 amended.
- 11 (6) For taxable years beginning or deemed to begin on or after
- 12 January 1, 2018, and before January 1, 2022, under the Internal Revenue
- 13 Code of 1986, as amended, the Tax Commissioner shall adjust the credit
- 14 amounts provided for in subsection (1) of this section by the percentage
- 15 change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, as prepared
- 16 by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, for
- 17 the twelve-month period ending on August 31 of the year preceding the
- 18 taxable year.

- 21 Cumulative Supplement, 2018, are repealed.
