- 2 and 50-407, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2018; to change
- 3 provisions relating to legislative subpoenas; and to repeal the
- 4 original sections.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

LB681 2019

1 Section 1. Section 50-406, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2018, is amended to read:
- 3 50-406 Any In the discharge of any duty imposed by the Legislative
- 4 Council, by statute, or by a resolution of the Legislature, the council,
- 5 any committee thereof, and any standing or special committee created by
- 6 statute or resolution of the Legislature may hold public hearings and may
- 7 administer oaths, issue subpoenas when the committee has received prior
- 8 approval by a majority vote of the Executive Board of the Legislative
- 9 Council to issue subpoenas in connection with the specific inquiry or
- 10 investigation in question, compel the attendance of witnesses and the
- 11 production of any papers, books, accounts, documents, and testimony, and
- 12 cause the depositions of witnesses to be taken in the manner prescribed
- 13 by law for taking depositions in civil actions in the district court. The
- 14 council or the committee may require any state agency, political
- 15 subdivision, or person to provide information relevant to the committee's
- 16 work, and the state agency, political subdivision, or person shall
- 17 provide the information requested within thirty days after the request
- 18 except as provided for in a subpoena. The statute or resolution creating
- 19 a committee may prescribe limitations on the authority granted by this
- 20 section.
- 21 Litigation to compel or quash compliance with authority exercised
- 22 pursuant to this section shall be advanced on the trial docket and heard
- 23 and decided by the court as quickly as possible. Either party may appeal
- 24 to the Court of Appeals within ten days after a decision is rendered.
- 25 The district court of Lancaster County has jurisdiction over all
- 26 litigation arising under this section. In all such litigation the
- 27 executive board shall provide for legal representation for the council or
- 28 committee.
- 29 Sec. 2. Section 50-407, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 30 2018, is amended to read:
- 31 50-407 (1) In case of disobedience on the part of any person to

- 1 comply with any subpoena issued on behalf of the council or any standing
- 2 <u>or special</u> committee <u>of the Legislature</u> thereof or of the refusal of any
- 3 witness to testify on any matters regarding which he or she may be
- 4 lawfully interrogated, the district court of Lancaster County or the
- 5 judge thereof, on application of a member of the Legislative Council
- 6 council, shall compel obedience by proceedings for contempt as in the
- 7 case of disobedience of the requirements of a subpoena issued from such
- 8 court or a refusal to testify therein.
- 9 (2) If a witness refuses to testify before a special committee of
- 10 the Legislature authorized pursuant to section 50-404 on the basis of the
- 11 privilege against self-incrimination, the chairperson of the committee
- may request a court order pursuant to sections 29-2011.02 and 29-2011.03.
