- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to agriculture; to adopt the Soil Health and
- 2 Productivity Incentive Act; and to provide an operative date.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 6 of this act shall be known and may be
- 2 <u>cited as the Soil Health and Productivity Incentive Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. The purposes of the Soil Health and Productivity Incentive
- 4 Act are to (1) improve soil health and productivity throughout the state
- 5 through the planting of diverse cover crops, (2) incentivize farmers to
- 6 plant cover crops, (3) increase farmer yields and profitability through
- 7 improved soil health farming practices, and (4) improve degraded
- 8 waterways to protect the public's health through increased water
- 9 <u>filtration with the application of cover crops.</u>
- 10 Sec. 3. For purposes of the Soil Health and Productivity Incentive
- 11 <u>Act:</u>
- 12 <u>(1) Agricultural land and horticultural land has the same meaning as</u>
- 13 <u>in section 77-1359;</u>
- 14 (2) Cover crop means a crop planted on agricultural land and
- 15 <u>horticultural land primarily to manage soil erosion, soil fertility, soil</u>
- 16 quality, water quality, water holding capacity, weeds, pests, diseases,
- 17 biodiversity, or wildlife;
- 18 (3) Department means the Department of Agriculture;
- 19 (4) Incentive means a cash payment made pursuant to the Soil Health
- 20 <u>and Productivity Incentive Act;</u>
- 21 (5) Qualified claimant means any individual or legal entity that
- 22 owns agricultural land and horticultural land and that has no more than
- 23 eight full-time employees who work as part of a farming operation. An
- 24 individual animal feeding operation that is tied to a larger industrial
- 25 operation with more than eight full-time employees is not a qualified
- 26 claimant;
- 27 <u>(6) Zone 1 means the following areas within this state:</u>
- 28 (a) Any land that lies within two and one-half miles of the Elkhorn
- 29 River and is located in Madison County, Stanton County, Cuming County,
- 30 <u>Dodge County, Washington County, or Douglas County;</u>
- 31 (b) Any land that lies within two and one-half miles of Logan Creek

1 and is located in Cedar County, Dixon County, Thurston County, Burt

- 2 <u>County</u>, or <u>Dodge County</u>; and
- 3 (c) Any land that lies within two and one-half miles of Maple Creek
- 4 and is located in Colfax County or Dodge County;
- 5 (7) Zone 2 means the following areas within this state:
- 6 (a) Any land that lies within two and one-half miles of the Platte
- 7 River and is located in Butler County, Colfax County, Dodge County,
- 8 Saunders County, Sarpy County, or Cass County; and
- 9 (b) Any land that lies within two and one-half miles of Shell Creek
- 10 <u>and is located in Madison County, Platte County, or Colfax County;</u>
- 11 (8) Zone 3 means the following areas within this state:
- 12 (a) Any land that lies within two and one-half miles of the Platte
- 13 River and is located in Dawson County, Buffalo County, Hall County,
- 14 Gosper County, or Adams County; and
- 15 (b) Any land that lies within two and one-half miles of the Big Blue
- 16 River and is located in Hamilton County, Polk County, Butler County,
- 17 <u>Seward County, Saline County, or Gage County; and</u>
- 18 (9) Zone 4 means any land in this state that is not part of Zone 1,
- 19 <u>2, or 3 and that lies within two and one-half miles of any river or</u>
- 20 <u>creek.</u>
- 21 Sec. 4. (1) The department shall award incentives under the Soil
- 22 Health and Productivity Incentive Act in order to encourage farmers to
- 23 plant cover crops. The funding for the act shall come from federal,
- 24 state, and local grants and any other funds designated for the purposes
- 25 of the act. The department shall accept applications for incentives
- 26 according to the following schedule:
- 27 <u>(a) For calendar year 2020, the department shall accept applications</u>
- 28 from qualified claimants who plant a cover crop during such calendar year
- 29 <u>on agricultural land and horticultural land that is owned by such</u>
- 30 qualified claimant and that is located in zone 1;
- 31 (b) For calendar year 2021, the department shall accept applications

1 from qualified claimants who plant a cover crop during such calendar year

- 2 on agricultural land and horticultural land that is owned by such
- 3 qualified claimant and that is located in zone 1 or zone 2;
- 4 (c) For calendar year 2022, the department shall accept applications
- 5 from qualified claimants who plant a cover crop during such calendar year
- 6 on agricultural land and horticultural land that is owned by such
- 7 qualified claimant and that is located in zone 1, zone 2, or zone 3;
- 8 (d) For calendar year 2023, the department shall accept applications
- 9 from qualified claimants who plant a cover crop during such calendar year
- 10 on agricultural land and horticultural land that is owned by such
- 11 qualified claimant and that is located in zone 2, zone 3, or zone 4;
- 12 <u>(e) For calendar year 2024, the department shall accept applications</u>
- 13 <u>from qualified claimants who plant a cover crop during such calendar year</u>
- 14 on agricultural land and horticultural land that is owned by such
- 15 qualified claimant and that is located in zone 3 or zone 4; and
- 16 (f) For calendar year 2025, the department shall accept applications
- 17 from qualified claimants who plant a cover crop during such calendar year
- 18 on agricultural land and horticultural land that is owned by such
- 19 qualified claimant and that is located in zone 4.
- 20 (2) The incentives awarded to a qualified claimant under the act
- 21 <u>shall be in an amount equal to:</u>
- 22 <u>(a) For a single species cover crop, twenty dollars multiplied by</u>
- 23 the number of acres within the applicable zone upon which the cover crop
- 24 is planted; or
- 25 (b) For a multi-species cover crop, forty-five dollars multiplied by
- 26 <u>the number of acres within the applicable zone upon which the cover crop</u>
- 27 is planted.
- 28 <u>(3) Applications for incentives shall be submitted on a form</u>
- 29 prescribed by the department and shall include:
- 30 <u>(a) The name of the qualified claimant;</u>
- 31 (b) The location of the agricultural land and horticultural land

1 within the applicable zone and the number of acres upon which a cover

- 2 crop is planted;
- 3 (c) An indication of whether the cover crop is a single species
- 4 cover crop or a multi-species cover crop;
- 5 (d) A receipt showing the purchase of seed for the applicable cover
- 6 crop; and
- 7 (e) Such other information as is required by the department to
- 8 determine eligibility for incentives.
- 9 Sec. 5. (1) If the department determines that the qualified
- 10 claimant qualifies for incentives, the department shall approve the
- 11 application within the limits set forth in this section and shall pay the
- 12 incentives to the qualified claimant.
- 13 (2) The maximum amount of incentives that may be approved for a
- 14 <u>single qualified claimant in any calendar year is forty-five thousand</u>
- 15 dollars.
- 16 Sec. 6. The department may adopt and promulgate rules and
- 17 regulations to carry out the Soil Health and Productivity Incentive Act.
- 18 Sec. 7. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2020.
