## **Introducer's Statement of Intent**

## LB1208

The following constitutes the reasons for this bill and the purposes which are sought to be accomplished thereby:

LB1208 reforms practices relating to restrictive housing, immediate segregation, discipline, and other conditions of confinement in state correctional facilities.

## These reforms:

- 1. Follow national best practices to ensure inmates are given enough out-of-cell time to maintain their health and mental stability;
- 2. Ease the transition out of segregation and better prepare inmates for successful release into the community;
- 3. Utilize a "step down" approach for moving inmates from restrictive housing into general population;
- 4. Cap the length of time that inmates can be in restrictive housing and provide for a hearing and appeals process;
- 5. Prohibit the use of "double bunking" in restrictive housing;
- 6. Outline measures for the use of confidential informants and informant testimony; and
- 7. Ensure up-to-date electronic records are shared with the Public Counsel/Ombudsman and Inspector General of the Nebraska Correctional System.
